"First the rains slowed up collections and then the flu epidemic seems to have hit us even harder," Walter L. Case, Goodwill's executive vice president, declared. The backlog from last summer's overflow is gone and collections have been below the 700 bag minimum for full employment.

Clothing is needed especially, Case said. It can be quickly cleaned, pressed, repaired, and sold in the Goodwill stores to provide the pay for those who have worked on it.

'Substance' Slated as Sunday Topic

The true nature of "Substance" as defined first by Biblical prophets and later by Christ Jesus will be the lesson-sermon subject in all Christian Science services Sunday.
