# Glamor Is the Word For a Texture Bread

Bread is the most ancient of man's prepared foods. Yesterday's homemaker made her own bread, a long process. Today's homemaker achieves a similar effect with a purchased loaf, which she flavors to perfection and serves piping hot. Hot flavored breads are playing an ever important role on the modern menu. Garlic bread is a favorite; but do try Chive Bread, or change of pace. Savory Bread starts as a loaf of unsliced white bread, and then it's specially cut and spread with a zesty mixture of Margarine flavored with paprika, Tabasco and minced parsley.

**CHIVE BREAD**  
1/2 cup soft-type margarine  
2 tbs. chopped fresh, frozen or freeze-dried chives  
1 loaf French or Italian bread  
Blend together margarine and chives. Cut bread into diagonal 1/4-inch slices al-

most to bottom of loaf. Spread margarine mixture on cut surfaces of bread. Wrap in aluminum foil. Bake at 425 degrees 15 to 20 minutes. Yield: About 8 servings.

**ENGLISH MUFFINS PARMESAN**  
1/2 cup soft-type margarine  
1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese  
4 English muffins  
Blend together margarine and grated cheese. Split English muffins; spread each half with 2 tsp. of the margarine mixture. Broil until lightly browned.

## Eggs Benedict Is Gourmet Favorite

**GARLIC RYE SLICES**  
1/2 cup soft-type margarine  
1/2 to 1 tsp. garlic powder  
1 slice loaf miniature rye bread slices  
Blend together margarine and garlic powder. Spread lightly over rye bread slices and place on baking sheets. Broil until lightly browned. Yield: About 3 dozen slices.

To prepare, place a broiled slice of ham on half a toasted English muffin, top with a poached egg, then cover with a creamy hollandaise sauce. Serve for breakfast or lunch, and delight your guests. **SAVORY BREAD**  
Blend 1/2 cup soft type margarine, 1/2 tsp. paprika, 1/2 tsp. Tabasco and 2 tbs. minced parsley. Trim crust from top and sides of one-pound loaf unsliced white bread. Cut bread in thirds lengthwise to about 1/4 inch from bottom of loaf. Make 5 cuts across bread to make 6 slices, also to about 1/4 inch from bottom of loaf. Spread
