New Desmond's Del Amo To Open Doors on Friday

Opening of Desmond's Del Amo on Friday as been announced by Fred B. Huesman, president of the pioneer retail apparel chain founded by Daniel Desmond in Los Angeles Plaza 104 years ago.

The new store, the 15th in the Desmond's chain will be the first to open in the Bullock's Fashion Square complex at Hawthorne Boulevard and Carson Street. It will be the sixth store to open since the 100th Anniversary Year in 1962, Huesman reported.

When completed, the Bullock's Fashion Square at Hawthorne and Carson will include 16 stores integrated into a unique urban shopping center patterned after Fashion Squares in Santa Ana and Sherman Oaks. The Bullock's store is scheduled to open this fall.

THE NEW Desmond's store is constructed of gullitoned concrete brick reminiscent in color and texture of the adobe brick used in early California structures. Large ceramic panels dramatize the classic simplicity of the exterior.

The interior of the store features separate men's and women's apparel shops, and a Campus Hall shop for young men, with individual sections for men's furnishings, sportswear and shoes. The men's shops, highlighted by a suspended red canopy, has walls of exterior gullitoned brick softened with rich teak.

The Rev. Mr. Mitchell said, "A Sunday school goal of 300 has been established for Easter Sunday and meeting goals of 225 and 250 have been set for the two Sunday revival meetings.

The public is invited to attend the services. Nursery care will be provided at all services.

Planner Quits Job In a Huff

A two-year veteran of Planning Commission service who is seeking election to the City Council resigned his post this week, charging that councilmen were more interested in a "rubber stamp" commission.

In a letter to the mayor and councilmen, Leo F. X. Salisbury, one of 16 candidates for three City Council seats, said he was resigning immediately.

In a list of grievances, Salisbury said he had been pressured as a commissioner, and said councilmen didn't always vote with the city's best interests in mind.

He was appointed to the Planning Commission in 1964 by Nicholas O. Dralle, then a member of the City Council. Dralle now is a candidate for mayor.

Education Benefits

Veterans planning to go to school under the new GI Bill do not have to rush to meet a deadline, Mort Webster, manager of VA's Southern California Regional Office, said today.

Although most benefits under the new bill are effective immediately, the education assistance benefits will not begin until June 1, Webster explained.

Late in April, the VA expects to have application blanks and full information available at all VA offices and at the admission offices in most approved schools.

Veterans will have ample time to select courses and make application without losing either class time or payments from VA, Webster said.
