

# North Spanks South, 3-1

## 5-Hitter Pitched By Wade

The name of the game is pitching. With Ken Pfau, the best pitcher in the Bay League for South, sidelined, and with Bruce Wade giving North some clutch effort on the mound, their season records tell a story.

South has lost four of its five league games, including three straight, and was almost counted out of the race yesterday.

The Spartans lost a 3-1 game to North, a team that has won 5 of 7 league games.

If South got any help at all yesterday, it was league leading Santa Monica's 5-4 loss to Mira Costa. This game also moved North closer to first. Only the margin of a split double header separates North and Samohi.

Redondo upped its record to 3-2 with a 3-0 win over Inglewood. Sage Welles pitched the shutout. The Seahawks' three runs in the seventh inning included a two-run single by Larry Gray. Meanwhile, South Coach Jerry McIvaine's superior pitching staff of Pfau and Glenn Thompson has accounted for only one win. The trouble is Pfau was injured after pitching a 9-3 victory over Mira Costa three weeks ago.

Ready or not, Pfau is needed in a repeat game against North tomorrow. He finished out last season as the best pitcher in the league and McIvaine had expected him to win 8 or 9 games this season.

North will counter with Dave McCormick tomorrow. Yesterday Bruce Wade hurled a 5-hitter against Thompson who allowed six bingles. However Thompson gave up a triple to Mike Barnes with two aboard in the fourth to decide the issue.

There were 83 individual, team, season, career, NBA and Sports Arena records tied or broken, highlighted by Jerry West setting a new NBA record for freethrows with 840.

The Lakers scored 9,557 points in winning 45 games and losing 35, winding up with an average of 119.4 points per game. The old team records, set in 1961-62, were 9,433 points and a 116.2 average.

The Lakers also smashed their one-game scoring record with 152 points against New York. The old mark was 141, set in 1961. The Lakers scored 151 points that same year, but in a triple overtime game. En route to the 152 the Lakers hit 63 field goals, wiping out a 5-year old record of 57.

Two other team records fell during the season. The Lakers hit 444 per cent of their field goal attempts, topping the old best of 441, and chalked up 1,933 assists, erasing the former standard of 1,881.

San Francisco holds a narrow 5-4 season edge over the Blades in the battle for the Coliseum Communion Cup which goes annually to the California entry winning the most games during the season series.
