The resolutions were endorsed following caucus discussions on education, transportation, youth, civic improvement, and mental health at the first joint community meeting of the three groups last Thursday at the Gulf Avenue Elementary School in Wilmington.

"These resolutions are expected to form the basis of the programs of the three councils during the coming year," said Robert deVries, Wilmington council president, speaking for the groups.
