Passover Celebrated With Seder at Temple Menorah April 5

Temple Menorah will herald the advent of the Passover holidays which is celebrated for seven days beginning the eve of April 4, when it will host a Passover Seder for all its members and guests on Tuesday, April 5, at 7 p.m. in the Community Hall of Temple Menorah, 1101 Camino Real, Redondo Beach.

Passover celebrates the escape of the Jews from the bondage of Egypt. During this seven day holiday, the Jew remembers his humble origin and praises God for the glory of freedom. On the first two nights of Passover, the traditional "Seder" is held. This festival meal follows a familiar order outlined in the "Haggadah" a book of holiday prayers, stories, and songs. Rabbi Jerome Unger and Cantor Richard Silverman will help the families gathered together to follow the Haggadah.

To help retell this poignant story many of the foods served have symbolic meanings. The most important is "Matzoh," an unleavened bread, reminding all that Moses and his followers could not wait for their bread to rise as they fled the land of their slavery. Matzohs and matzoh meal are eaten throughout the duration of Passover as a substitute for leavened breads and flour. For the seven days of Passover, special foods are served. Since unleavened bread or other grain products must be eaten, the housewife faces a challenge in meal planning. Traditional recipes are passed on from generation to generation.

The delicious Passover Seder meal is being planned and cooked by the Sisterhood members. All of the traditional favorites will be served.

During the meal a piece of matzoh, called the, "afikomen", is hidden to be found by one of the children. Traditionally the finder receives some little gift as a reward.
