

Erich Fromm to Speak At El Camino College

Erich Fromm, author of the much-discussed book, "The Art of Loving," will lecture at El Camino College at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 14, in the Men's Gymnasium.

Dr. Fromm's topic will be "Obstacles to Love," which is the title of his latest book dealing with human relations. As with his books, Fromm's lectures are developed from a life of experience in the fields of psychoanalysis, philosophy, political science and religion.

BORN IN Frankfurt, Germany, he studied sociology and psychology at the universities of Frankfurt, Munich, and Heidelberg. Dr. Fromm received his Ph.D. in 1922 from Heidelberg University.

He was trained in psychoanalysis at both Munich and the Berlin Institute of Psychoanalysis.

When Fromm visited the United States in 1933, he was invited to lecture at the Chicago Psychoanalytical Institute. He settled in the United States in 1934 and later became a citizen.

HE HAS been a guest lecturer at such universities as Columbia and Yale and at the New School for Social Research.

His background includes professional membership on the faculty of the William Alanson White Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology, and Psychoanalysis. He has also served as a diplomat of the American Psychological Association, as a member of the faculty of Bennington College, as a professor at Michigan State University, and as professor of Psychology at New York University.

Dr. Fromm has authored such books as "Escape from Freedom," "Man for Himself," "The Forgotten Language," "The Sane Society," "Sigmund Freud's Mission," "The Dogma of Christ, and other Essays" and his newest book, "The Obstacles to Love."

WITH HIS wife, Annis, Dr. Fromm now resides in Mexico, where he is head of the Department of Psychoanalysis

Citizen's Council Urges Passage of Transit Bills

Strong endorsement of enabling legislation for financing of a Southern California rapid transit system now before the State Assembly was given by the Citizens Advisory Council on Public Transportation, John V. Vaughn, chairman, announced today.

The Citizens Advisory Council is a volunteer organization of 60 community lead-

ers representing every part of Los Angeles County, formed to work with local government, business, labor, and transit district leaders to foster agreement and cooperation leading to realization of a rapid transit system for the metropolitan area, Vaughn said.

The Council has not endorsed a particular rapid transit system. It has not

backed a specific long range financing proposal. It believes debate on these specifications is premature at the Legislature to give us a green light so that we can get down to work on these specifications.
