### Aliens Must File Report This Week

Aliens must file address report forms by the end of this week, according to George K. Rosenberg, district director of the immigration and Naturalization Service.

The law requires that every alien except those having diplomatic status, representatives of certain international organizations, and persons admitted temporarily as agricultural laborers, must file the address report during January of each year at the nearest post office or Immigration and Naturalization Service office.
