

SC Slates 'Renewal' Seminar

A seminar in urban renewal will be conducted at the Civic Center campus of the University of Southern California, 145 S. Spring St., beginning Feb. 8. Richard England, executive director of the Redevelopment Agency of Redondo Beach will conduct the sessions.

A two-unit course meeting Mondays from 8:30 to 8:10 p.m., is oriented towards the interests of the career public administrator or student who may wish to learn the basic elements of the urban renewal program.

The class will include the study of the origin and characteristics of blight, its elimination through urban renewal, its prevention through the program for community improvements, the relationships of city planning, federal and local responsibilities, and the role of the private enterprise and citizen participation.

Rites Held For Area Lumberman

Requiem mass for William Edward Upton, founder and chairman of the board of the Independent Building Materials Co., Inc., was celebrated Thursday, Jan. 28, at Holy Trinity Church in San Pedro. Rosary was recited Jan. 27 at the Utter-McKinley Lakewood Mortuary Chapel.

Mr. Upton, who died Jan. 25 at the Eel Air Hospital, was a resident of Long Beach. He began his career in the lumber industry in 1945 and built the Independent Building Materials Co. into one of the largest firms of its kind in the state. His widow, Hazel, was recently named president of the firm.

Well known in yachting circles in San Francisco and the Balboa Bay area, Mr. Upton was a member of the Bahia-Corinthian Club, the Bal Ray Club, and the St. Francis Yacht Club of San Francisco. He was a veteran of World War II, having served in the Army.

He is survived by his widow, Hazel, a son, Paul K., and a daughter, Barbara, all of the home address. In addition, he is survived by a brother, W. H. Upton of Dallas, Tex., and three sisters, Zula Heiner of Marysville, Calif., Bernice Pinkston of Los Angeles, and Nadine Phillips of San Jose, Calif. Entombment was in Holy Cross Mausoleum.

Motorists Warned on Smog Device

Motorists are cautioned against removing or altering their crankcase emission control devices, according to Dr. M. Patrick Sweeney, supervising engineer, California Motor Vehicle Pollution Control Board.

Rumors of such practices, particularly in counties that have withdrawn from the used car portion of the state installation program have been reported to the Los Angeles board," said Dr. Sweeney.

Such alteration, especially plugging of the device, can lead to serious consequences, such as loss of oil. The "blowby" gases, regulated by the device, must escape from the crankcase.

"Any attempt to plug the crankcase will result in pushing the gases out through the dipstick opening, along with engine oil," Dr. Sweeney continued.



