### L.A. Board Candidate to Appear Here

Poblano, who presently serves as Assistant Southern California Administrator for the California State Disaster Office, is a candidate for Office No. 2 of the Los Angeles Board of Education.

Long active in educational affairs and a former high school and junior college instructor in the Los Angeles City School System, he pioneered compensatory education in this state.

He researched and authored California's first compensatory education bill, and presently serves as education advisor to the Equal Opportunity Foundation.

### New Tests To Be Used In Schools

Physical performance tests designed to test the physical fitness of students will be administered to students in the grades in Torrance this spring.

Use of the tests this year was approved by the Board of Education Monday. The tests must be given to students beginning next year if present law remains unchanged.

The tests were prepared by the State Department of Education and are given to the public schools without charge. Their purpose is to identify physically underdeveloped students and to adapt physical education classes to students' needs.

## Hungarian Dancers To Appear

The Hungarian Ballet "Bihari," now touring the United States for a second time, will appear at the San Pedro High School auditorium Friday evening at 8:15 o'clock.

The performance is under the sponsorship of the San Pedro Community Concert Association.

The troops, which features Nora Kovach and Istvan Rabovsky, is composed of dancers and musicians who have defected from communist-controlled Hungary. The ensemble combines folk dances and a gypsy orchestra with classical ballet.

Kovach and Rabovsky, who are husband and wife, met while students at the Budapest Ballet. They studied with the Leningrad Ballet Company and were leading members of the company until they returned to Hungary.

The couple escaped into West Berlin while on a tour in 1953 and have since appeared in the United States, England, France, Spain, and South America. They also have toured in the Far East, Australia, and New Zealand. Musicians in the ensemble play only original Hungarian folk music and several well-known classical compositions.

Van Pool ran into the driveway in time to see Rogers crash through the garage door. The detective was nicked on the leg.


Rogers, whom Van Pool claims jumped bail, escaped.
