Volunteer Workshop Is Slated For Area Women

A day-long workshop designed to acquaint South Bay women with the importance and function of Volunteer Workers in any hospital will be held Feb. 18, at the Los Angeles County Harbor General Hospital, 1000 West Carson St. Torrance.

The program will be chairmanned by Mrs. Joseph Jay, president of the HGH Patient Services Division sponsoring the Workshop.

"This is not merely a 'Day at the Hospital,' Mrs. Jay said. 'The intent is to acquaint beginners and others who may be interested in Volunteer Work how they can replace hours of boredom with a needed and worthy service.'

"Auxiliary units and staff members of other hospitals are invited to attend and at the same time learn about the County's newest \$15,400,000 Acute Unit nearly two years old," she added.

The Workshop will be divided into two sessions. Registration will begin at 8:30 a.m. with a program of informative discussions to open at 9 o'clock in the hospital's Assembly Room on the first floor off the Vermont Avenue main lobby. Registration fee includes luncheon at 1:15 p.m.

Dr. Dirk teGroen, former

medical director at Harbor and now in that capacity at El Cerritos Hospital, Long Beach, will discuss "The Physician Looks at the Volunteer." Dr. Benjamin Cutsall, Harbor Medical Director, will speak on "Medicine Influx," and "Emotional Needs of Children" will be discussed by Dr. Rita Rogers, head physician, Child Psychiatry Clinic. These discussions will be followed by a question period and coffee break.

After the latter, A. L. Thomas, administrator, will discuss "The View From the Top," Miss Eileen O'Brien, director of Social Service, will probe "The Community and Social Welfare" and Mrs. Marguerite Broen McAllister, chief of Patient Services, will offer "Information Please," outlining the qualifications for Volunteer participation.

Following lunch there will be a panel discussion on "How Can The Volunteers Be A Vital Force" with Mrs. Blanch Miller, associate director of Nursing, moderator. The panel will consist of Miss Margaret Orchard, director, Occupational Therapy, and Volunteers; Mmes Robert Estherly, James Jordan, and Stanley Lewis. The panel will answer questions from the floor. Questions should be prepared in writing, Mrs. Jay said.

For Women of the Area YW Offers Class in Vocational Guidance

Torrance YWCA is again offering their class in Vocational Guidance for Women. This class, especially planned for the woman interested in going back to work, includes testing, individual counseling session, and eight sessions with speakers on many subjects designed to help a woman discover what kind of a position for which she is fitted.

Testing in aptitudes and interests and the explanation of the test; profile and a personal counseling session is done through the cooperation of the State Department of Employment, Torrance Branch.

Other sessions will include speakers on many different subjects with time for questions and answers. The sessions will include experts in their fields speaking on job opportunities for women in the South Bay area in merchandising, clerical, hospital services, civil service, industry and many others. One session will be on training opportunities offered in this area in adult education, university and private schools. Another session will be on the employment interview and how to prepare a resume. Other sessions include success on the job, and psychological adjustments in the home

when a woman goes back to work.

This is a public service class offered by the YWCA for a small fee. Because of the testing the class is limited to 20 women. The class will start Tuesday, Feb. 16 and will meet at the Torrance YWCA each Tuesday for eight weeks from 10-12 noon.

A similar class will be offered in the evening soon for women unable to attend the daytime class.
