Champion Saxons Avenge Inglewood

Tartars Hosts To St. Monica In First Round

The CIF (Southern Section) basketball playoffs, represented by first and second place teams from 32 leagues, will begin Friday night in the "AA" division. The Pioneer League champion Torrance High Tartars are hosts to St. Monica's Mariners in a first round game at the Torrance gym.

West High of Torrance will compete in the "AA" bracket as the Pioneer League's No. 2 representative Friday night. The Warriors made sure of it yesterday by clobbering Lawndale, 92-78, but Coach Tom Sutherland won't know where his squad must travel to until later tonight. The opposition, however, will be either Buena High of Ventura or Simi High.

The CIF "Triple A" playoffs do not begin until next Tuesday and the pairings will not be available until later in the week, according to Commissioner Ken Fagans of the California Interscholastic Federation.

Redondo, unbeaten in 22 games, is expected to be seeded No. 1 in the "AAA" tournament. Its Bay League counterpart, South High, is the league's No. 2 contender with a 9-2 Bay record.

St. Monica (9-3) finished behind Fermin Lasuen (11-1) in the Camino Real League race. Fermin, the defending "AA" champion, travels to Laguna Beach to open the playoffs against runner-up Laguna Beach Artists (8-2) of the Orange League.

St. Monica has a high scoring varsity that compiled a 14-5 record during the basketball campaign. The starting unit is the fivesome of Bob Klein, John Conlin, Dana Bible, Ed Maloney and Terry Schofield.

Torrance's regulars are Fred Carpenter and Bart Johnson at forward, Rich Davies at center, and Bob Brennan and Walt Hale at guard.

Coach Will Boerger of Torrance said he would bolster his varsity with the addition of Rich Kreul and Mike Troup from the junior varsity.

Favorite in the Double-A division is Righetti High of Santa Maria. The team has a 21-1 record, losing only to Mira Costa in the Ventura Tournament.

Spartans Cinch 2nd in Bay Race

South High has been assured a spot in the CIF basketball playoffs after winning 2nd place in the Bay League race yesterday. The Spartans won their ninth league game from winless Rolling Hills, 75-46, for a 9-2 standing. Palos Verdes was put out of reach of the Spartans with its 35-31 loss to Redondo. The Sea Kings are third with a 7-4 mark.

South plays Palos Verdes Friday in a warm up game in preparing for the CIF playoffs next Tuesday. Pairings and game sites are not to be revealed until Friday.

Rolling Hills ended its first Bay League season with an 0-12 record. The team saw its last chance of salvaging a win go down the drain on a 20-point effort by Ed Holmes and 19-point game by Center Steve Kuchenbecker. Both are juniors.

Coach Jim Hanny said he would increase his roster to 12 players for the playoffs. Four players will be brought up from the junior varsity or Bees, he said.

Against Rolling Hills the junior varsity of South won 61-38. The South Bees won 84-26, and the Bees cinched a tie for the Bay League title with a 35-19 victory.

Hoffman finished out the game with 18 points, 10 on free throws, and it was right there the Seahawks won, 11-7 in the free throw column.

The win was the 11th league victory and 22nd of the season without a loss for the Hawks who close their campaign at home Friday against Santa Monica.


