## Realtors Support Plan To Nullify Court Fiat

The 49,000-member California Real Estate Association (CREA) has gone on record in support of Constitutional amendment allowing one house of state legislatures to be elected on a basis other than population.

Some 1,000 CREA directors, meeting at Anaheim, adopted a resolution to that effect and commended the California State Legislature for its position regarding the proposed federal amendment.

The resolution stated: "WHEREAS, the California Real Estate Association commends the action taken by

the California State Legislature, memorializing Congress to set in motion the necessary machinery for amendment of the Federal Constitution, to restore to the States their traditional right to a bicameral legislature, where one House can be elected on the basis of factors other than population.

"THEREBY, consideration of geographical, economic, and factors other than population in the shaping of the United States Congress is consistent with the Constitution and basic to the republican form of government which the Constitution guarantees to each state, and therefore we urge the enactment of an amendment to the Constitution which will permit each state having a bicameral legislature to apportion not more than one house of such legislature in accordance with factors other than population."

The CREA action follows a similar resolution on re-apportionment adopted by the National Association of Real Estate Boards.

## Paved Roads Good, But The Rest Are for Oxen

"We had thought of driving in Mexico. But have heard you must have a very rugged, high-clearance car like a jeep or Land Rover."

Not at all on the dozen major highways. They are paved — sometimes a little bit of chuckhole stretch. But that's because repairs are slow.

A half million Americans a year drive down here in the family car. I'm doing it now in my own little British MG — certainly not high-clearance and no more than average rugged.

Now if you are going into back roads, that's different. There are remote areas where you want the jeep-style car. The roads are made for ox wagons. And I just about shook everything off a Pontiac station wagon putting it over a mere three miles of this kind of country.

"What about garages and emergency repairs?"

There is supposed to be a new, roving Mexican highway repair service. But I haven't SEEN them yet. Lots of garages. And they can do

pretty good repairs with improvised equipment.

If you need major parts from a larger town, it can be frustrating. I sat three days in Tepic, telephoning for parts from Guadalajara, 140 miles away. Finally, I hailed a taxi and rode in style the 500 miles to Mexico City. But my car came down eventually. And the cost was moderate.

"We leave New York at 10 minutes before midnight and arrive in Paris at —"

And you arrive Paris mid-day and worn out. Change your flight. Fly daytime. Arrive at night and go to bed. Next day you're OK. Arrive daytime and you can't sleep. And it will take you a precious week to get to feeling right.

"Appreciate if you could tell us the weather in Madrid in August?"

Summer desert hot. In July and August, even the Government closes down. Go north to the mountains. North to the Cantabric coast. North

and east to the Galician coast on the Atlantic — (which I like best). But Madrid and south are miserable. After mid-September they're very pleasant.

There are some fine old villages and country inns and trout streams in the mountains in the north. They use whippy fly rod about 15 feet long. I imagine you could rent them.

Then there's the Gredos mountains. And a Government-operated inn — the Parador of Gredos. If you scout the countryside, you run into miles of mountain Roman road. Roman block-houses with Latin inscriptions. Fallen down Spanish castles. A local cheese in the inns and pretty good wine.

"Where do you find out about health precautions for foreign travel?"

U. S. Public Health gives a list of recommended shots for various parts of the world. I've seen several books by doctors. But when I read these things, I get all the symptoms. Before I even get my visas.

If your doctor says you're

OK — (no special condition or medication) — the general tourist route seems fairly safe. Most people find the hazards are sunburn, the continuous champagne route and the seven-course lunch and dinner.
