A 6-run fourth inning turned a 2-1 South High deficit into a 10-run rout of Palos Verdes yesterday. Catcher Phil Hertzog hit a 3-run home run in the rally.

South's fourth league win at the Palos Verdes campus dropped the Lancers further down the cellar with a 1-6 record.

After PV's Bill Tapp homered past left centerfield with one aboard in the first frame for a 2-0 lead, South struck for a run in the third, six in the fourth, and singles in the fifth and seventh innings.

The big six-run fourth came with two outs. Ed Holmes, Russ Courtney and Glenn Thompson loaded the bases and were sent home on singles by Craig Moore and Dick White. Catcher Hertzog then unloaded a 360-foot drive over the left field for a 3-run home run.

Hawthorne's 3-1 upset win over Mira Costa and Santa Monica's 8-2 triumph over Redondo left every club with two losses except South which has a 4-1 mark.

## Six Baseball Games Won by El Camino

With six Metropolitan Conference victories and one loss to their credit, the El Camino College baseball squad is idle until next Tuesday, when the Warriors travel to Santa Monica.

During the past week, Coach Chuck Freeman's Warriors nipped Valley, 10-9. Both teams collected eleven hits but a bases-loaded double in the top of the ninth by shortstop Carey Hubert gave the Warriors the edge.

El Camino overcame an 8-7 deficit in the top of the ninth inning as John Yeater and Tom Evans both walked. Catcher Mike Brooks felled a bunt sacrifice but then singled on a two-strike-pitch to fill the bases. Bernie Schulz walked to force in the tying

run and Carey Hubert delivered his decisive blow.

The Warriors returned home Friday and ripped East Los Angeles, 9-2. It was their second conference conquest over the Huskies, victims of an 11-5 assault earlier.

Southpaw John Wojcik picked up his first win this season, hurling six innings, fanning four and walking two. Ray Allen, who finished, struck out five while giving up no hits or runs.

The Warriors jumped off to a 3-0 lead in the first inning on one hit, two errors and five wild pitches. For the rest of the game, the club scored twice in the third on four successive singles and

twice in the eighth on two singles and a triple.

Larry McWhirter carried a big stick for the Warriors, clubbing two singles and a triple, driving in one run and scoring three times. Center-fielder Gene Cooper slashed out two singles in four trips to the plate and the remainder of the Warrior starting nine all had one hit apiece.

Overall El Camino collected 13 hits.

# Young Pitchers May Make Knights Tough

There is so much good young baseball talent at Bishop Montgomery High this spring, Coach Marvin Wood has stocked his varsity with 18 players for the Camino Real League campaign.

The Knights are particularly supplied with young pitchers, including two ranking juniors Tom Thomsen and Irl Davis.

Irl came into the limelight at Montgomery as a freshman with a series of low-hit pitching efforts and started his present Camino Real League campaign against St. Bernard's last week by tossing a 2-0 no-hit win.

Thomsen, who first made a hit as a sophomore, has not given up a run in two league outings. Following his 2-0 shutout of St. Monica's, Thomsen came back with a 0-0 deadlock against Pater Noster yesterday in an 8-inning duel.

Hitting has always been scarce at Montgomery and the Knights must again rely

on few runs and great pitching in order to come close to the school's first league title.

The only senior members of the squad are Shortstop Dave Hunt, Bill Brown, the classy basketball whiz, and Catcher Bill Bedsworth.

Sophomores dominate the field with Dan Graham's hitting earning the second base job. Mark Gerhardt has won the first base job and Chuck Bongard, normally a second sacker, has shifted to third base to get a starting post.

Bob Comstock, a sophomore, and Mike Fones, a junior, roam the outfield, although Irl Davis starts in left field when Thomsen pitches.

Mike Ramariz, a freshman, and Jim Garbonati, a sophomore, are the third and fourth pitchers.

Backing up the infielders are Harold Salcido and Gary Nesenson, with Joe Pickett available at first.

Mike Gray, Jim Richards and Ramariz back up the outfield. Nelson Straley is the No. 2 receiver.

Going into their fourth game on Friday the Knights play at Crespi.

## MAKE THE GOLFERS PAY:

# Revenues Sought For New Courses

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn has proposed a study toward increasing county golf course green fees so more courses can be built to serve the recreational needs of local communities.

Hahn said an increase of 25 cents per nine holes would raise \$303,300 annually which should be earmarked for new courses.

The Supervisor stressed that this would have the golfers who utilize the courses pay for them, rather than have the general property taxpayers pay for the needed facilities.

He pointed out that with hundreds of thousands of golfers in Southern California, Los Angeles county's present 11 courses are always crowded and it is common for reservations to be

made weeks in advance for weekend play.

Supervisor Hahn asked the parks and recreation commission to study the proposal, consult with interested golfing groups, and make recommendations to the board of supervisors in time for consideration at 1965-66 budget hearings.

Current fees at County courses are \$2.50 for 18 holes and \$1.25 for 9 holes on week days, and \$3 for 18 holes and \$1.50 for 9 holes on weekends.
