

Refresher Course for Nurses to Begin May 3

A "Nurse Refresher Course," sponsored by the California State Employment Service in conjunction with Harbor General Hospital and Harbor College, will get under way May 3.

The course is designed for registered nurses who have been inactive for several years and wish to update their knowledge of techniques and equipment before returning to work.

The training is scheduled for 10 weeks, five nights a week, Mondays through Fridays, from 6 to 10 p.m. It includes 90 hours in classroom lectures and 110 hours in hospital floor training, both in Harbor General Hospital.

THE MAJOR part of the floor training will be in the hospital's "Intensive Care Unit," which features the latest developments in nursing equipment and techniques.

Qualified trainees may receive transportation allowances and benefits up to \$55 weekly. The course is financed by the Federal Manpower Development Act and is tuition free.

Lomita to Participate In Labor Law

The City of Lomita will participate in the Economic Opportunity Act, Public Law 88-452. Purpose of the program is to provide work and training for the unemployed and unemployable.

The city's participation will be conducted in cooperation with Harbor College which has a work study operation in effect.

Program participants will not be hired in lieu of regular employees, but rather to supplement them. At present time only additional parttime employees are contemplated under the Act.

The city council has authorized Stanley D. Green, city administrator to use college students as park employees for a total of 7,272 hours. Of the total cost of \$13,046, the city will only pay \$1,304.60.




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
