ARMED FORCES DAY

March Air Base Entries To Compete for Trophies

Jan Bradshaw, Miss Torrance of 1965, in a recent visit to March Air Force Base offered the 15th AF Bandmen a glimpse of the Best Military Music Unit trophy they will compete for in the sixth annual Torrance Armed Forces Day Parade May 15.

Jan, an El Camino College student, learned that many of the white vapor trails marking skies over the Los Angeles area are made by the Strategic Air Command bombers from March Field, March Field, near River-

side, gave Jan a lesson in its history as the largest Air Force installation in Southern California and one of the oldest, first activated in 1918. It is currently Headquarters for the 15th Air Force under the command of Lt. General Archie J. Old Jr.

SINCE THE DAYS of training "Jenny" pilots in World War I, March Air Force Base has been a focal point of advanced Air Force development. Typically, it is now home base for the 22nd Bombardment Wing of the Strategic Air Command, under Commanding Officer Col. George J. Pfeiffer Jr.

Jan also got an escorted tour down the flight line for an intimate look at a gigantic B-52 jet bomber, just returned from Guam. Its six-man crew of "Blue Tail Flies" takes the 200-ton Stratofortress on weekly routine flights from March to Guam and back. During the 12-hour flight, the SAC bomber is refueled by a high-speed, high-altitude KC-135 jet tanker.

Inside, Jan checked out the crew's working quarters; the compact cabin housing for the craft's two pilots and the electronic warfare officer's position; directly below is just enough room for the navigator and radar navigator. The balance of the interior is left to a huge complex of electronic equipment and cargo except for the tail gunner's position at the rear, equipped with its own radar and 20 mm cannons.

ALONG WITH the 35-man 15th AF band, March will also send 76 airmen and air women to march with the base Color Guard in the Torrance Parade. Additionally other Air Force parade and display entries will include the crack Edwards Air Force

Base Drill Team and a "Reach into Space" from the Space Systems Division.

The Air Force will be joined by regular reserve, national guard and ROTC units of all service branches in one of the nation's largest Armed Forces Day celebrations sponsored by the city and the Torrance Chamber of Commerce. Local high school bands and drill teams also will participate.

Armed Forces Day general chairman George S. Wing has announced that parade starting time is 10 a.m. Saturday, May 15. Grand Marshal Charles T. Hitch, assistant secretary of defense, will lead marchers westward on Torrance Boulevard from Cabrillo Street, past the civic center reviewing stand to the display area.

The parade will be preceded Friday night by a gigantic fireworks display at the civic center, starting at 8:30.
