will be represented by the 63rd Infantry Division Color Guard and four battalions from the 31st, 15th, and 27th Infantry; the 2nd and 3rd Brigade staff and Color Guard; the 7th Battalion, 40th Armor; 6th Battalion, 4th Infantry; Detachment 1, Company B, 17th Special Forces Group (Airborne). The 3rd Air-Naval Gunfire Liaison Company will represent Marine Corps Reservists and the Navy Reservists will send the U. S. Naval Reserve Marching Unit from Santa Monica.

Parading military youth organizations will include the UCLA Army, Navy, and Air Force ROTC drill teams; the University of Southern California Naval ROTC Drum and Bugle Corps, drill team, and color guard; and the Loyola University Air Force ROTC band, color guard, and two drill teams. Competing high school ROTC entries are the band, company, color guard and drill team from David Starr Jordan High School, and the ROTC company, drill team, and color guard of Long Beach Polytechnic High School.

Other youth entries include the Long Beach, Group VII, California Wing of the Civil Air Patrol; U. S. Naval Sea

Cadet marching units from North Hollywood and Beverly Hills; plus the Brown Military Academy color guard and drill team.

IN ADDITION, the West High School band, drill team and pep squad; the North High School band and drill team; the Torrance High School band, drill team, and pep unit; South High School band and drill team; Hawthorne High School band and drill team; and the Redondo Union High School band and drill team will all be marching in spirited competition with last year's award-winning Trona High School band and drill team.

All entrants are making last minute preparations for the precision show in which they will be competing for coveted trophies in several categories.

THE SEVEN perpetual trophies are:

- The Chamber of Commerce Gold Trophy for the best exhibit area entry.
- The Mayor's Trophy for the best local entry.
- The All-American City Award for the best military musical unit.
- The Governor's Trophy for the best National Guard entry.
- The Secretary of Defense Trophy for the best reserve forces unit.
- The Secretary of Defense Trophy for the best regular forces unit.
- The Los Angeles Chapter, Association of the U.S. Army Trophy for the best military drill team.

In addition, eight non-perpetual trophies have been donated by Torrance citizens for awards in the following categories:

- Best aerospace exhibit.
- Best combat exhibit.
- Best combat support exhibit.
- Best ROTC unit (Sr.)
- Best ROTC unit (Jr.)
- Best civilian entry.
- Best civilian music entry.
- Outstanding Entry, open class marching unit
- Outstanding Entry, open class motorized unit.

Trophies will be awarded at an invitational luncheon for military and civic dignitaries immediately following the parade.

THE TWO-DAY patriotic salute, sponsored by the city and the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, will also feature

a fireworks extravaganza Friday evening at 8:30 in the civic center.

Informative exhibits and aerospace displays will be open at the civic center beginning 6 p.m. Friday and again Saturday until 5 p.m.

Some of the display entries include a Sikorsky HH52A amphibious helicopter from the Coast Guard Air-Rescue Station at L.A. International Airport. From the 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing at El Toro will come three different helicopters: a Sikorsky UH-34, Bell UH-1E, and Vertrol CH-46.

Military aircraft on display will be represented by two F-102 Delta Dagger super-sonic jet fighters built by Convair.

TALLEST DISPLAY is an 80-foot Air Force Thor-Agena missile-satellite space research vehicle.

Air Force air-launched missiles will include the air-to-ground strategic Hound Dog and a Quail decoy missile will be on display.

The Navy will provide a working scale model of the Sidewinder missile.

A 1/2-scale cutaway model of the Mercury Spacecraft will be displayed by the U.S. Treasury Department.

AN INDOOR display titled "Reach Into Space" will be provided by Headquarters, Space Systems Division, Air Force Systems Command.

Additionally, many of the tanks, artillery, and motorized vehicles seen in the parade will be available for inspection in display area afterwards.

Armed Force Day general chairman George S. Wing states that the parade will surpass the 1964 spectacular and will contain many new entries. He has urged all citizens throughout the greater Los Angeles area to join the city and chamber to salute the men and women who make the U.S. Military Power for Peace.
