**City Library Won't Purchase Own Books**

Torrance won't begin purchasing its own books for the five libraries which serve the city — at least for now, according to a report from the Library Commission. Commissioners delayed action on a proposal that the city purchase its own books after City Manager Edward J. Ferraro advised the commission of the difficulties which would be encountered. Ferraro said purchasing the books now would involve duplicate handling and processing since the books would have to be re-processed should the city establish its own library system. maintenance and depreciation of the books, Ferraro added. He also said no books should be purchased by the city until a long-range plan for acquisition of books is established. The city currently operates its library system under a contract with the county. Employees, books, and other library services are provided by the county in buildings owned by the city.

**Moral Breakdown Cited At Jehovah Assembly**

Main theme of the three-day Jehovah's Witnesses' assembly was the "rejection or abandonment of Bible principles as the chief cause of moral breakdown." Mr. Harry C. Good, district supervisor, labeled the argument — "The Bible in these times is not practical" — invalid. Citing examples of cheating and thievery, Mr. Good said, "It is far more practical to apply the principle. 'Do to others as you would have them do to you,' than to have to keep a constant check on the activities of associates."
