

George Neill, Early City Banker, Developer, Dead

Private funeral services were held Monday at Forest Lawn for George W. Neill Sr., 88, pioneer Torrance banker and land developer. Mr. Neill, who has resided at 1317 1/2 N. Alta Vista, Hollywood, for the past 15 years, died Saturday at St. Vincent's Hospital in Los Angeles after a year-long illness.

Other positions held by Mr. Neill include president and director of the Torrance Development Co.; and director of the Torrance Lime and Fertilizer Co., the Industrial Housing Corp., Western Glass Products Co., Torrance Auditorium Co., Dominguez Land Corp., Torrance Water, Light & Power Co., Torrance Masonic Building Assn., and the Torrance Hospital Association.

Active in Republican Party activities, Mr. Neill served as secretary of the Nebraska State League of Republican Clubs from 1905 to 1912, and from 1906 to 1912 he represented Nebraska on the executive committee of the National League of Republican Clubs. In 1912 he was a Nebraska delegate to the Republican National Convention in Chicago which saw the party split when Theodore Roosevelt walked out and formed the Bull Moose movement.

Mr. Neill is survived by his widow, Carrie, two children, Mrs. L. E. Adams of Escondido and George Neill Jr., of San Mateo, and by five grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Adult Education School Slates Summer Classes

Summer courses will be offered in the Torrance adult education program for a six-week session beginning June 21, according to Raymond Collins, principal of the Torrance Evening High School. The adult education summer program was first offered last year on an experimental basis. A total of 18 courses will be taught this summer, providing enrollment reaches minimum levels, Collins said.
