California Federation of Women's Clubs, junior membership, will hold its annual state convention beginning tomorrow and continuing through Sunday at the Hilton Hotel in San Francisco.

Members of the two Junior Women's Clubs of the area, both affiliated with the Federation, the Redondo Beach Dianias and the Torrance Junior Women's Club, are planning to attend.

"Prologue 66" is the theme of the three-day event, at which resolutions involving health and safety will be studied. One resolution calls for a state law requiring testing of newborn babies for Phenylketonuria, a condition which can cause brain damage or mental deficiency if not detected and corrected soon after birth. A simple, inexpensive test can reveal the condition but, at present, is not required by law.

A second resolution to come before the convention concerns the establishment of minimum safety standards for sliding glass doors and picture windows.

Many programs will be reviewed, such as school dropouts, outdoor conservation education, birth defects, and mental health treatment. Informative exhibits will be on display and workshops conducted by state officers will occupy the delegates.

Awards for the Build-a-Better Community program will be presented at a banquet Friday evening, at which time new state officers will be installed.

Concluding convention activities will be a luncheon Saturday, with Mrs. Edwin Bryant, president of the California Federation of Women's Clubs, as speaker.
