

Model Congress Meets in Class

History has stepped out of the archives and into the daily lives of 100 eighth-grade "legislators" at a Torrance school.

Participating in a year-long "model congress" at Carr Elementary School are students in Carroll W. Newberry's history and government classes.

Featured as a program highlight at the Torrance Educational Advisory Committee May luncheon meeting, the Model Congress is based on a concept originated by Mrs. Irma Wilson, a Torrance teacher.

STUDENTS in Newberry's classes serve as members of the United States House of Representatives, the Senate, the cabinet, and the judicial branch of government.

While working in each of the different capacities, students act upon legislation which was debated during the period of history they are studying. By rotating branches of government, students get a crack at each phase.

To prepare them for acting out their government roles throughout the year, they began history classes last fall with a mock national convention in the school cafeteria.

BEFORE THEY could get down to the business of making laws, they tackled the job of learning how to write bills and the procedures they must go through to become law, and they became thoroughly grounded in the rules of parliamentary know-how.

Allowing themselves three weeks to cover every 20 year period of United States history, student congressmen settled down to settling the problems that have confronted their adult counterparts over the years.

Although they didn't always come up with the same solutions as the Washington, D.C., Congress arrived at, they did base their legislation on the same techniques.

Material for pending legislation was researched, bills were written, argued within the committee, amended, and argued again on the congressional floor.

HIGHLIGHTING the Model Congress demonstration at the Torrance Education Advisory Committee luncheon was discussion of bill before the House of Representatives during the Franklin Roosevelt era which attempted to increase the size of the Supreme Court.

Purpose of the Model Congress approach to teaching American history, according to Newberry, is threefold: to tie American history and government together so as to make clear their interdependence on each other; to create

School Health Service Improved, Report Says

Recommendations made by a consulting educator-physician to the Torrance Unified School District a year ago have been put into practice this year, according to a report made to the Board of Education by Dr. Louis Kaplan, assistant superintendent for special services.

In his semi-annual report on school health services, Dr. Kaplan said this year's program has included plans to redesign procedures and functions according to suggestions made by consultant Oliver Byrd, MD, Ed. D.

On the basis of the suggestions, school nurses at all levels have been participating in research and making recommendations of their own concerning many of the duties they perform.

Activities stimulated by Dr. Byrd's evaluation include slides and tapes portraying the role of the school nurse, work with community agencies regarding possible establishment of a community clinic, and a survey of causes of chronic absenteeism and chronic visits to the nurse's office.

A ten-year blueprint for health services has been formulated and plans for a health education curriculum committee were initiated by Mrs. Penny Scott, supervising nurse, the report stated. Schools throughout the district participated in a series of three first aid meetings for the faculty.

Faculty workshops set up by high school nurses have dealt with venereal disease education, home nursing safety and first aid. High School nurses have also sponsored Medical Careers Clubs for students.

Montgomery Junior Enrolls In Summer Program at UCLA

David Hermeyer, a junior at Bishop Montgomery High School, has qualified for the National Summer Science Program at UCLA by scoring 1,409 points on the scholastic aptitude test. A high score of 1,600 is possible on the test.

Thirty students were accepted for the program from among some 500 applicants.

Hermeyer, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Sylvester Hermeyer of 89 Surf St., Harbor City, is a member of the Montgomery Science Club and runs

both track and cross country. His hobbies include working in a home chemistry lab and making miniature surfboards. He hopes to attend the California Institute of Technology or UCLA after graduation from Montgomery.
