

ECC Staff To Appear On 'Scope'

Twenty El Camino College instructors will score on Scope in coming weeks. Responding to an invitation to participate on the Channel 7-KABC production of the educational series, the college instructors are currently adding auditions to an already-crowded schedule of end-of-semester activities.

Offered the opportunity of preparing a series of educational productions on the daily 7 a.m. program, a college committee circulated information regarding the program, hopeful of interesting enough volunteers to assure participation.

More than twice the number of programs requested were volunteered by the instructional staff, these varying subject-wise from "The Resting Heart" to "How to Dress a Wig."

EVEN THE challenge of a two-week deadline for five programs scheduled for taping within a two-week period failed to discourage the potential TV artists. Most instructors indicated that they would be able and willing to prepare both audio and visual portions of their presentations in time for early taping.

Heading the campus campaign to audition the wide variety of performances is Dr. Jeannette Camiglia, who has spearheaded the campus talent search in behalf of the newly-formed Academic Senate. Assisting in the coordination of program arrangements is Harold Wennstrom, dean of the fine arts division.

Rounding out the committee membership are Paul Shepard, philosophy instructor; Carl W. Meadows, dean of the life science division and Richard Schwarzman and W. A. Kamrath, coordinators of audio-visual and public relations services.

Teachers Look Into City's Past

A couple of third-grade teachers whose local teaching stints began the year the school district was organized are peering into their past.

Not only are they refreshing their memories of the early years of the local school system; they are digging into the city's past as well.

Joining them in their quest for knowledge of Torrance's beginnings are 80 third-grade teachers.

As Mrs. Eva Thomas of Edison School and Mrs. Marilyn Hickson of Watteria School, members of the original Torrance Unified School District faculty, recall first-hand experiences of the city's first schools, 2,700 youngsters throughout the city are studying the history of Torrance for the very first time.

TO PREPARE teachers for the new addition to the third-grade history course, district personnel held a workshop recently at the Educational Materials Building.

Pictures taken of local historic spots which had been made into study prints were displayed, a specially-planned historic bus tour to be offered to third-graders was described and teachers were shown a series of booklets written for the students in third-grade language based on information contained in the district-written teacher resource book, "History of Torrance."

BOOKLETS introduced at the workshop were: "A Town Is Born," "They Helped Our City Grow," "Our City Government," "Our City Services," "Transportation and Communication," "From Fields to Factories," and "Going to School."

Explaining background material were the books' three authors, Mrs. Ada Belle Myers, Mrs. Harlene Reeves, and Mrs. Deen Schrank, also third-grade teachers.

Coordinating the workshop and publication of the booklets and resource guide was Mrs. Gertrude Aldershof, curriculum consultant.
