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ALL 'ROUND THE TOWN

GALLEY WEST . . . the newest link in the ever expanding chain of traditional fine restaurants operated by Interstate Hosts will open its doors to the public on Monday, June 7. Galley West at Marineland suggests a time when ancient Spain's majestic galleons of exploration sailed the shores of Colonial Mexico and California and began the historic achievement of the Spanish New World Empire . . . The rugged forms of the galleon are suggested in the architectural details of the restaurant—the entrance as the elaboration of a galleon's stern cabin—in the antique paneled walls reminiscent of early navigators' quarters . . . Sturdy masts support beams

of the "Lookout" bar and dining salon. . . .
"THE ENTRANCE Companion Way" . . . directly forward is the portrait of the Portuguese Navigator, Juan Rodriguez Cabrillo, discoverer of Santa Monica Bay and environs in 1542. He is depicted against the seascape with Santa Catalina Island in the distance and is painted in the style of XVI Century Mexico by James Wegner. . . .
Mementos from other historical voyageur periods are displayed in "The Entrance Companion Way." For one, the early XVIII Century English pub wall clock to the right of the Cabrillo mural. At the time of Captain Cook's famous explorations of the Pacific, English law decreed severe taxes on time pieces displayed in public establishments—consequently clocks were rare and when displayed were unusually large as compensation. The cabin entrance to the "Lookout" is marked by one of the period's lovely figureheads like our Senora Medina, goddess of the winds. She was "released" from a ten foot block of sugar pine by sculptor-artist, James Wegner . . .
THE "LOOKOUT" (seating 130) . . . Directly ahead is a Lord Nelson mounted spy glass from London for patrons wishing to identify passing vessels. Century-old weathered boards of the bulkheads suggest galleon planks . . . and window blinds of canvas recall ancient sails . . . XVII Century charts from the logs of the most famous of the early navigator-explorers adorn the bulkheads together with captain's chart lanterns inspired from a French XVII Century original. The old blends with the new in the "Lookout" Room. There is a piano bar and dance floor. "The Bridge" a private dining room with a banquet capacity of 75 is a snug paneled retreat with many mementos of early sailing days. Rare barometers, Spanish ship models and other nautical memorabilia . . . Interpreted in the carpet is an early XIX Century New England coverlet pattern, "The Pine Tree."
