From Capitol Students Will Get New Flag

A flag which has flown over the U. S. Capitol in Washington, D. C., will wave atop a Torrance school during the final few days of school.

The flag, being presented to Riviera School by Senator George Murphy, will be given to student council President Molly McLeod during Flag Day ceremonies Monday, June 14. Capt. James Rider, a Marine aviator from Camp Pendleton, will present the flag on behalf of Senator Murphy.

The Flag Day program will climax a year's work in American Heritage studies, according to Robert Allen, principal. Recognition of district accomplishments which led to the Torrance Unified School District's receiving the American Heritage Award earlier this year paved the way for the donation of the flag to the local school, Allen said.

CARRYING more than 800 individual flags ranging from the early Viking banner to the present 50-star version, students will depict the evolution of the American flag. The program will feature 23 predecessors of the present day flag.

Highlighting festivities will be a musical program by the Drum and Bugle Corps of the First Marine Division Fleet Marine Force from Camp Pendleton.

FOLLOWING the event, the nation's flag will be raised over the school for the remainder of the week, after which it will be placed in a special case donated by the PTA and housed on the wall of the cafeteria.

Coordinating the student program is the faculty American Heritage committee, under the direction of Leonard Duncan. The event will be open to the public.

Joslyn Studio Plans Special Summer Class

Jack Kling of Chouinard Art Institute will instruct art classes for teenagers during the summer session of the Joslyn Studio of Arts. The Joslyn Studio is sponsored by the Torrance Recreation Department.

Classes will begin Tuesday, June 22, in painting and ceramics. Tuesday classes are scheduled for persons 13 to 16 years old, while Thursday sessions will be held for those 16 to 19 years of age.

A four-week session will cost \$1.50. Fees for the full eight-week course will be \$3.

KLING ALSO will be in charge of the Artists Studio for adults. Classes will meet each Thursday evening beginning June 24.

Philosophies of art from the Renaissance periods to the Pop art of today will be discussed and students will

have the opportunity to work in such mediums as watercolor, oils, acrylics, collage, and drawing materials.

Kling joined the Chouinard Art Institute faculty in 1964, following his graduation from the school. He also teaches at the Sofia (Montessori) College in Santa Monica.

THE JOSLYN Studio of Arts will conduct art and craft classes for children, evening classes for adults, and several special classes during the summer.

Adult classes include oil painting, flower arranging, jewelry making, watercolor, creative stitching, ceramics, and a senior citizen hobby shop. Erika Muhl, studio art director, will head the Craftsman Studio program.

Emergency Telephone System Due

An emergency freeway telephone system, designed to serve the needs of more than 225,000 motorists daily, will be in service on a 10-mile stretch of the Harbor Freeway by July 1, the Pacific Telephone Co. has announced.

When completed, the system will be the first of its kind in the United States. A company spokesman said Pacific plans to install 80 telephone call boxes on opposite shoulders of the freeway between the Santa Monica Freeway interchange and El Segundo Boulevard.

All stations will have a direct connection to the Los Angeles Police Department's communications center at 150 N. Los Angeles St.

The system is designed to provide "total communications" with the police department for the reporting of freeway emergencies, the company spokesman said.

Space Flights Render Valuable Heart Data

The weightlessness of prolonged manned space flights directly influences the cardiovascular system.

This comment was made at the 16th annual luncheon meeting of the Los Angeles County Heart Association by Dr. Lawrence E. Lamb, Chief of Aerospace Medical Sciences Division at Brooks Air Force Base in Texas.

Continuing his speech titled "Space Flight—Profits for Hearts," Dr. Lamb said, "Decreased levels of activity, such as space flights, are thought to result in smaller blood supply to the heart muscle. In turn, prolonged inactivity makes the person more susceptible to atherosclerosis or other factors that lead to heart attacks."

"THIS IS TRUE even though the individual has rigorously maintained weight control and other dietary measures thought to present heart disorders. Exercise of all the muscles—particularly

the heart muscle—is a must, regardless of diet. Studying the relationships of these factors has already proved very useful in the practice of medicine."

Dr. Lamb, was guest speaker at the luncheon in the Biltmore Bowl attended by more than 600 heart association volunteers.

Special feature of the luncheon was the premiere of the new Los Angeles County Heart Association's 15 minute color film, "Heart Beat." A special project of the board of directors, the film cost was underwritten by their personal contributions.

It will be available without cost to schools, clubs, organizations and industry and shows the programs supported by the citizens of Los Angeles County through the annual Heart Fund Drive each February.
