## CHP to Install Disc Brakes and Defrosters

New California Highway Patrol cars will be equipped with front wheel disc brakes and rear window defrosters starting July 1, according to Commissioner Bradford M. Crittenden.

The decision to seek these equipment items followed experimentation in various areas of the state.

"We have had eight cars with disc brakes and 20 cars with rear window defrosters on the road for several months. Our experience with

both has been that they will increase the safety of the officer behind the wheel."

The disc brakes and defrosters will be supplied on both 1965 and 1966 year model vehicles. The patrol will purchase 334 of the 1965 model and 557 of the 1966 model. Dodge will furnish the vehicles, based on its low bid accepted this week by the State Office of Procurement.

The cost per vehicle will be \$2565.29. The disc brakes represent \$99.72 of this cost; defrosters \$21.82.

Miss Barbara Strobel is the sponsor.

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

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
