



This is a rare concoction, which can be found in many places in New Orleans, a few in San Francisco; some in the Los Angeles area, but none which can boast the method and ingredients of cioppino made by Chef-Tony.

To prove how little Millie regards competition, at one time she had printed a number of recipes telling how to make cioppino at home. In only a short time, mail inquiries and personal requests emptied the small cards from her supply. People are inter-

ested in exotic food and most good home-cooks will try a restaurant item at home even though they may find it difficult to transpose the fact that restaurants make it in large supply; have exactly the same ingredients day in and day out, but also have the experience and professional background to make it "come out" the same, day and day after . . .

Meanwhile as the area grows so does the Seafood Grotto and Redondo Beach. Millie has the distinction of having utilized more advertising on radio and in newspapers than any other individual establishment in Redondo Beach for the past eight years.

For a while Millie extolled the climate—the fact that she could compete with Fisherman's Wharf in the San Francisco Newspapers, of all places and believe it or not, San Francisco visitors came to eat, not to question, on trips here and left knowing more about a place called Redondo Beach, the oldest and possibly best located of Southern California's beaches, and agreeing that "the food served by Millie Riera is no better in the north!"

Millie is now enjoying a large trade which heretofore hesitated to drive down from farther places than the immediate area for lunch and afternoon parties. Only recently Millie has attracted customers from clubs and societies from San Fernando Valley; the Pasadena-Arcadia area and even from the Orange County, many parties driving over for an early or late lunch.

Try this place. The food is excellent. Their seafood is as good as you can get anywhere only the prices are not elevated, even though some seafoods at times can become scarce. The reason for this too, is obvious; Millie's family (brothers) own quite a large sea-going vessel which catches as many fish as any boat out of San Pedro and her contacts with the fishing company people of all sorts goes back almost as long as her years, so The Seafood Grotto in Redondo Beach will never suffer from a lack of rare seafood for its tables. Those interested in small or large parties for afternoon lunches, banquets or get-togethers, early or late, can easily arrange by calling Millie personally. She is willing to cater to parties from 6 to 30 as long as the parties break up in time for the evening trade.

On week-day evenings busi-

ness is good. On the weekend it is big and calling for reservations, particularly on Friday or Saturday is usually advised.

Sunday dinners begin early in the PM. The Seafood Grotto is open every day from 11 a.m. until 12:30 a.m. A man by the name of Major usually presides at the bar and his reputation for a good mixer, in beverage as well as personality is known.

Try this place. Call 375-1483 and get a line of prices from Millie and the food ranges from "way out" seafood to (naturally) Italian style food, with fish and it is all good. Cioppino made the place famous as well as Millie's made Cioppino famous. If not, why so many imitators lately when 2 years ago you would have to go far and wide to find it on any menu regularly?
