

'Heart' Plans Annual Dinner

The second annual "hearts and flowers" dinner, sponsored by the Los Angeles County Heart Association, Southwestern Branch, will be held at Alondra Park, 3850 Manhattan Beach Blvd., Lawndale, June 24, 6:30 p.m.

Hearts friends and their families from the Southwestern section, Westchester to Wilmington, are invited. Guests may reserve a catered box lunch of fried chicken or bring their own basket lunch. Reservations, which will close June 18, are \$1.25 and may be made by telephoning 371-3591.

The Rev. Richard Wong, associate minister of the First Methodist Church, 1551 El Prado, will deliver the invocation.

TORRANCE residents who will participate in the program include the Watson triplets, David, Daniel and DeWayne, sons of Mr. and Mrs. John Watson of 3126 W. 79th St. David underwent heart surgery at Harbor General Hospital two years ago.

Rita Hickenbottom, 21829 Carolale Ave., a student at Stephen White Junior High School, will be featured also. Rita had heart surgery at Children's Hospital in Los Angeles in 1964.

Other local residents on the program will be members of the "Bobby Twins," Tops Club of Torrance, including Mmes. Paul Sanchez, Richard A. Yarger, and L. W. Harmon.

LOCAL PHYSICIANS will be Dr. Ronald T. Picirillo, cardiologist, who will be in-

stalled as 1965-66 chairman of the branch, and Dr. Richard J. Lescoe, who will be presented the branch's top honor for his many hours of dedication in promoting the life-saving closed chest cardiac resuscitation programs throughout the area and county.

Approximately 200 heart neighbors will be cited for their time and effort in helping to halt the number one crippling — heart and circulatory disorders.

General Lists Rate Reduction

A reduction in rates on multi-message units within the Los Angeles extended area has been introduced by General Telephone Company of California, according to Allan R. Stacey, vice president-revenue requirements, for the utility.

"The new toll and message unit rates will appear on all customer bills dated on or after June 19," Stacey said. "Message units which were 4.25 cents each were reduced to 4.05 cents June 10.

Long Distance rates between points in California became effective on that date also. Calls of more than 80 miles within California now cost five to 25 cents less for the first three minutes, depending on the distance and type of call. Some charges for additional time talked also will be less.

CHP Urges Check-up on Bike Safety

Warm weather is here, school will be out in a few days, and youngsters are turning with renewed interest to their bicycles.

To prepare for a summer of trouble-free riding, youngsters should check now to make sure their bikes are in top-notch condition, taking particular care to assure that brakes and lights are in good working order, Bradford M. Crittenden, Commissioner of the California Highway Patrol, said.

"Bicycle brakes must be able to make one wheel skid on dry pavement. For after-dark operation, bicycles must be equipped with a white light on the front—visible for 100 yards. The rear reflector can be supplemented with a red light."

THE COMMISSIONER emphasized the critical danger to which bicycle riders are exposed when they ride at night without lights.

"Bicyclists frequently escape a motorist's vision even in daylight. At night the driver has a far more difficult time. Often he can be virtually on top of a bike before he sees it. Putting the required light on a bicycle is a matter of simple self-protection," he declared.

IN ADDITION to reducing its rates, General will refund to its customers the difference between the new rates and the rates charged on most calls handled between July 20, 1964 and June 10, 1965. The company will file a plan to the California Public Utilities Commission concerning the refund.

Completion Due on New PV Street

Improvement of Granvia Altamira between Hawthorne Boulevard and Monero Drive in the Palos Verdes Estates area is scheduled for completion this week.

Supervisor Chairman Burton W. Chace said the \$15,860 project includes widening the 24-foot wide roadway to provide a fully curbed 64-foot arterial.

The job, awarded to Oswald Brothers Co., includes concrete curbs and gutters, and appurtenant work.

Supervisor Chace said Granvia Altamira is designated as a secondary highway on the county master plan of highways, comprising an integral part of the growing traffic system in the Palos Verdes Peninsula.
