Entrants must be residents of Redondo Beach and starting the first grade or above this fall. No students entering high school, ninth grade or up, can participate. All entrants must register at the playground during the week or they may not participate.

In Jerusalem Professor To Pursue Research

Dr. Gene M. Tucker, 22702 Cerise Ave., assistant professor of religion at the University of Southern California, will spend the summer in Jerusalem continuing his research into contract forms and legal terminology of the Old Testament.

Supported by a \$1,000 Summer Research Fellowship granted by USC's Associates, and another \$1,000 gift to the Graduate School of Religion for research in his field, Dr. Tucker is now in residence at the American School of Oriental Research in Jerusalem and will be accorded use of the French Dominican Ecole Biblique.

Dr. Tucker's research on legal forms and terminology will include the Old Testament and other writings of the ancient Near East. In connection with his research, he is visiting historical sites in Jordan, Egypt, Lebanon and Israel, according to Dr. Geddes MacGregor, Dean of USC's Graduate School of Religion.

Dr. and Mrs. Tucker will attend the International Congress for the study of the Old Testament in Geneva, Switzerland, Aug. 21-27.

Assembly Set By Jehovah's Witnesses

More than 110 members of the Torrance congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses are expected to attend the assembly session to be held in San Diego July 8 through 11, according to Leonard Olliff, presiding minister of the local church. Attending the session from Southern California, Arizona and part of Mexico will be more than 25,000 delegates.

Assembly subjects will include the use of the Bible in the modern home and the application of the "Word of Truth by ministers to the problems of life."

"The assemblies have always been a milestone in the growth of Jehovah's Witnesses," Olliff continued, "and we are looking forward to this one to prepare many more ministers to increase their ability to assist others."
