National Supply Moves Western Sales Office Out of Torrance

The National Supply Division of Armo Steel Corp. announced it is moving its Western Area sales office and oil field supply store from the Torrance Plant to Long Beach.

A joint statement of Glenn C. Merkley, works manager in charge of plant operations, and Robert D. Stottlemeyer, area manager in charge of oil field sales activities, said the shift does not affect manufacturing operations at the Torrance plant. To some 30 employees involved in the move out of the division's local employment of approximately 800 are members of Stottlemeyer's oil field sales organization.

Air Force Offers Men Education

Two special educational programs, Operation Bootstrap and Airman's Education and Commissioning Program, are supported by the Air Force, according to S/Sgt. Raymond Stauble, recruiter in the Air Force Enlistment Office, 1616 Cabrillo Ave.

Produced by the Air Force to keep its personnel abreast of the scientific and technological advancements, Operation Bootstrap also enables active duty Air Force members to complete requirements for a high school diploma or a college degree.

BOTH OFFICERS and men may enroll in off-duty classes on campus when a school is located near their base," the sergeant said. "Some schools even conduct classes on base. Locally, several Air Force personnel are attending colleges in the Los Angeles area."

THE AIR FORCE may pay up to 75 per cent of the tuition costs for such classes. When only one year is required for a college degree, the member may be assigned directly to a college of his choice to finish his education. While in college, he continues to draw full pay and allowances.

Under the education and commissioning program, Sergeant Stauble stated, carefully selected airmen on active duty are assigned to a college or university for undergraduate study. After graduation, they attend Officer Training School for three months and are commissioned second lieutenants.

plant on the West Coast, specializing in the manufacture of rotary drilling equipment. The plant also serves the needs of such basic industries as steel, aluminum, mining, aircraft, cement, hydroelectric power, and military defense.

The new 24,000-square foot Long Beach facility is located at 901 W. 12th St., adjacent to Long Beach Freeway and Anaheim Street.

The area office was relocated there as of Monday. The transfer of the supply store will be completed tomorrow.

Stottlemeyer said the relocation was motivated by a desire to better serve offshore customers. The new site is also easily accessible by freeways to all major oil development in the Los Angeles Basin.

The Long Beach store will maintain large inventories of all types of supplies used in the drilling and production of oil, including large inventories of oil country tubular products.

STOTTELMAYER said the Long Beach facility will supplement its service operation with the division's manufacturing facility in Torrance. The Long Beach facility will also have complete telephone and teletype communication service with all parts of the United States through both the local Long Beach and Los Angeles direct lines.

National Supply Division, long prominent in oil development throughout California, also has manufacturing facilities at Los Nietos, and Houston and Gainesville, Tex. The division operates oil field supply stores in the United States, Mexico and Venezuela, along with a vast overseas sales network to serve foreign markets in the free world.

National Supply is one of four divisions of Armo, the nation's fourth largest steel company in terms of sales. The three other divisions are the Steel Division, the Metal Products Division, and Armo International Division.
