

Ballparks Ready For Tournaments

This has been a week of dressing up baseball diamonds for tournament competition in Little League, Pony League and Babe Ruth playoffs. Little League games are scheduled for Tordondo and Carson this evening, and continuing almost daily at Southwood and Freeway Field until the district championships at Tordondo on Saturday July 31.

ALL-STARS DRILL FOR FOOTBALL

Football practice got under way this morning at Hawthorne and Leuzinger high schools for the first annual South Bay All-Star Football Game at El Camino Stadium Aug. 5.

Pitting the East against the West, outstanding prep graduates from 20 high schools have been divided into two teams for the game. Hawthorne Blvd. is the dividing line.

The West is working out at Hawthorne and the East at Leuzinger. Workouts will be twice daily.

50-Lap Race Gets Field Of 80 Cars

The largest super-stock car field of the year, more than 80 cars and drivers from all parts of California are set to compete in this Sunday afternoon's 50-lap open competition championships at Gardena's Ascot Park.

Heading the field of champions from all of California's top stock car tracks will be three reigning champions, Ron Hornaday of San Fernando, Clem Proctor of Paramount, and "Roarin'" Oren Prosser of Granada Hills.

George Sidio, president of Southwood Little League, returned home from Florida and the launching of "Vala" to take charge of a segment of District 26 playoffs starting tomorrow.

For the league's six tournament games Southwood completed construction of a block scorer's booth and storeroom, and an extension to the concession stand.

Ralph Avakian, president of Tordondo Little League, says his ballpark has been readied for nine tournament games, including the District 26 and 27 deciders, and a bi-sectional between the two districts on Tuesday, Aug. 3.

The league has made a point not to disturb a family of skunks which frequents the park at night.

Carson Little League, in its third season, is located at Sepulveda and the Harbor Freeway.

District 27 administrator Bob Rumbo, former president of Freeway Little League, says the Freeway league has put its ballpark in top shape for tournament games.

West Torrance Pony League will be host to district and sectional games beginning Saturday. League President George Schindler is in charge of field preparations.

Babe Ruth League games for both the major and 13-year-old tournaments moved into competition Monday at Torrance Plaza Del Amo Field.

Marine Biologists To Survey Waters

The Department of Fish and Game research vessel, Alaska, will leave San Pedro tomorrow on the first of four oceanic fishing surveys off California and Mexico.

Marine biologists will survey coastal waters from Magdalena Bay in southern Baja California to Point Reyes in Marin County.

Biologists from Mexico and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service will also take part in some of the cruises. The last of the five separate trips will end on Dec. 2, 1965.

General purpose of the survey is to study the pelagic environment between Magdalena Bay in Mexico and the San Francisco area in California to collect data on which to base continued sound management of California's ocean fishery.

Density, age, size and recruitment of inshore populations of sardines, anchovies, pacific mackerel and jack mackerel will be measured in the survey. The scientists will collect live and dead anchovies for blood genetic and eye lens protein racial studies.

Major collecting tool will be the midwater trawl designed by DFG personnel. Night-light blanket net stations will also be worked.

The cruise will give the biologists a chance to use a new echo sounding technique for detecting the number and species of fish schools.

Steeplechase Scheduled For Ascot

Motorcycle daredevils will lead America's outstanding riders at Ascot Park Friday and Saturday night in the fourth annual Grand National 50-lap steeplechase championships.

Confirmed entries have been received from Bart Markel, Flint, Mich., and Roger Reiman, Kewanee, Ill., giving the race two top national wheelers.

"It's the finest entry list we've ever had for a national motorcycle event in Southern California," said a happy J. C. Agajanian.

Reiman, who sports No. 1 on his Harley-Davidson, is the defending Grand National individual champion, and a three-time winner of the Daytona 200-miler, the motorcycle counterpart to the Indianapolis "500."

Markel, winner of 14 AMA title races including four TT's at Peoria, Ill., won the USA crown in 1962.

Dick Mann of Richmond, Calif., is the 1965 national leader and also won the title in 1963, the year he captured Agajanian's steeplechase.

Mert Lawwill of San Francisco is second in current USA standings and Gary Nixon, Baltimore, Md., is third.

This trio is entered along with such other national winners as Dick Dorresteyn, San Pablo; Dick Hammer, Lakewood, and Sid Payne and Dave Palmer, Bakersfield.

Dorresteyn won the Ascot chase in 1962, Palmer in 1964.

Dick Taylor of Seattle, the AMA's high point steeple chaser in 1964, and Dana Donaco of Portland, No. 1 USA amateur last year, add more class to the loaded field. The expert field will be pruned to 24 for Saturday night's 50-lap race.

270 WINS AND 29 LOSSES: Tappa Keggas Set For 300th Game

Winners of the 1964 American Softball Association State Slo-Pitch League Championship and innumerable local titles, the Torrance Tappa Keggas will play its 300th slo-pitch game Friday at 8 p.m. at Torrance Park against the Long Beach Sailors.

In recognition of the event, Elmer "Red" Moon, Torrance Recreation Department supervisor of sports, has scheduled an appropriate ceremony.

The Torrance youth band will play a concert from 7:30 to 8 p.m., Councilman Ken Miller will throw out the game ball, and refreshments will be served by the department.

The Tappa Keggas began this year with a record of 245 wins and 21 losses, and have a 270-29 record going to Friday's 300th game.

The team was organized in 1958. Chuck Ryan and Chuck Schoendienst, members of the original team, are still active. The Tappa Keggas began

as a Torrance recreation ball team, dominating the recreational leagues for four years. Finding suitable opposition became a problem. Red Moon and Ryan solving the difficulty by founding the West Coast Slo-Pitch Association.

The association, now in its fourth year, includes eight outstanding teams from Los Angeles, El Segundo, Gardena, Redondo Beach, Santa Ana, San Pedro, Long Beach and Torrance.

Sponsored by Taft Allen Realty of Torrance, 11 of 14 players reside in Torrance. During their eight-year existence the team has never forfeited a game or had one postponed.

Among Tappa Keggas' 33 games this season, 20 have been played in the West Coast League. The team won the first round with a 9-3 record but trail Redondo (8-0), El Segundo (6-2), Los Angeles (5-3) and Gardena (5-3) in the second half with a 4-4 record.

Batting averages for the team to date are Mick Ryan (.377), Ed Williams (.355),

Chuck Schoendienst (.354), Jim Reynolds (.306), Ron Jackson (.302), Bob Ryan (.301), and Gib Matthews (.290).

Pitching for the team is handled by Manager Ryan and Jim Wyzard.

Manager Chuck Ryan attributes their achievement to team organization, pride in accomplishment and a burning desire to compete.
