

Summer Seminar Studies Campus

El Camino College is more than an institution of higher education this summer. It also serves as a classroom project. Under the direction of Dr. B. Lamar Johnson, recognized as one of the world's foremost authorities on community college education, 27 students enrolled in a seminar in junior college administration, are focusing upon El Camino for their summer study.

"El Camino College was chosen," Dr. Johnson said, "because it is one of the colleges which has a lot of information about it. It has been active in self-study."

IN THEIR examination of the campus, instructor and students have visited the campus twice this summer to observe facilities, organization and administrative procedures.

"We are preparing students," Dr. Johnson observes, "in the areas of curriculum, instruction, plant facilities, finance, community services and relationships, student personnel and staffing." On their own, students establish appointments to discuss aspects of these subjects in depth with members of the college administrative staff. Their reactions have been summarized in the frequently-repeated exclamation, "and we've found the doors wide open!"

Dr. Stuart E. Marsee, whose role as a college administrator is expanded as a member of the board of directors of the American Association of Junior Colleges, has defined leadership for the group, amplifying his remarks with narratives taken from personal experiences. Among the axioms which he presents to prospective college presidents and superintendents is, "Do

things in such a way that your story may be proudly told!"

HAVING MET with the group on campus, Dr. Marsee will meet with the seminar once more at UCLA. Among advanced students enrolled in the course are two educational leaders from the nation of Columbia. They are Dr. Daniel Heneo-Heneo, chief of the academic division

of the Association of Columbian Universities, and Luis Barrios, chief of the Superior Education Section of the Ministry of Education. Other educators representing overseas school and foreign nations in the class are Leslie D. G. Brooks, director of adult education in north and west Vancouver school districts in British Columbia, Canada; John H. Colbaugh,

headmaster of the Antilles School in the Virgin Islands, and Nasser Jamali, of Iran. Ten states are represented among the balance of the class, and several students who are instructors or administrators at California colleges have enrolled. In previous years, Dr. Johnson has used Bakersfield and Orange Coast colleges for his seminar study.

County Libraries End Year With New Record

Use of public library facilities in Los Angeles County increased by slightly more than 10 per cent during June, setting a new record for circulation as the Public Library closed its fiscal year, William S. Geller, county librarian, said today.

Geller said use of the five Torrance branch libraries increased almost 15 per cent. Circulation rose to 57,507 from 50,178 for June, 1964.

County-wide circulation for the fiscal year which ended June 30 was 10.2 million books and magazines, Geller said.

Most significant increase in the Torrance area was recorded at the new North Torrance Library, where 10,296 books and magazines were borrowed. The library reported a circulation of 7,829 during June, 1964.

Other Torrance branches and their circulation figures for June include: El Retiro, 9,515; Isabel Henderson, 12,462; Torrance, 17,647; and Waverly, 7,587.

Figures for libraries serving surrounding communities include: Lomita, 6,661; Gardena, 17,042; Carson, 13,722; and Dominguez, 3,329. The Villa Carson Library, a children's library, reported 3,150 transactions.

Dominguez Gets New Fire Truck

Assignment of a new, 1,250-gallon-per-minute fire pumper to increase fire safety in the Dominguez area was announced today by Supervisor Chairman Burton W. Chace.

The new triple-combination pumper will be temporarily assigned to Station 105 in Compton pending completion of Station 127.

When the new station, located at 2060 E. 223rd Street, is completed, the new rig will be transferred there, according to Fire Chief Keith E. Klinger.

Designed to rigid county fire specifications, the new equipment contains a 500-gallon water reserve, a high pressure centrifugal pump, and latest fire-fighting equipment, Chace said.

The fire pumper was manufactured by Crown Body and Coach of Los Angeles on a low bid of \$38,000.
