Future Teachers Gain On-the-Job Experience

Half a dozen eighth-grade girls at Parkway Elementary School who hope to be teachers someday have been learning the ropes this summer. The future teachers helped kindergarten and first-grade teachers during summer school.

The sextet spent the first week of summer school observing the classroom teacher and have been assisting

ever since. Their activities range from mimeographing lessons to lining up students for recess. While the first-grade teacher is busy with a group of students studying reading or arithmetic, the student aide frequently helps other members of the class who run into a problem with their work.

She might help a child spell a word or might take him to the blackboard to figure out an arithmetic problem that has him stumped. Frequently, she listens to the students read or reads to them.
