

Observatory Show Uses Ranger Photos of Moon

The rugged terrain of the lunar surface, its deep craters and high mountains, will be studied at close range by audiences during the presentations of Griffith Park Observatory's planetarium theater's current show, "A Trip to the Moon and Saturn," according to the Los Angeles City Recreation and Parks Department.

Photos taken by Ranger 9 and paintings by Chesley Bonestell are projected onto the theater's 75-foot domed ceiling, producing a feeling of actually being in a space-

ship which blasts off from Earth, hovers over the moon and finally lands in a huge crater. From this vantage point the earth may be seen in the black sky, lighting up the floor of the crater and its surrounding walls.

ARMCHAIR astronauts next take off for Titan, Saturn's largest satellite and the only one in the solar system known to have an atmosphere. This atmosphere scatters the sun's short light waves producing a blue sky on Titan, similar to that on Earth.

Open every day of the week through Sept. 12, the scientific center's planetarium theater schedules shows at 3, 8 and 9:15 p.m. daily. Extra shows are offered at 1:30 and 4:30 p.m. on weekends.

ADMISSION TO the theater is 75 cents for adults and 30 cents for students 5 to 18 years of age.

The Observatory's Hall of Science includes a wide range of functioning scientific apparatus such as a submarine periscope, a telescope and experiments demonstrating the nature of light and energy. The hall is open free to visitors from 2 until 10 p.m. weekdays and weekends from 1 to 10 p.m.

Half-Year Sales Report By Aeronca

All performances will be in Bovard Auditorium at 8:30 p.m., with the exception of the operas, which will start at 8 o'clock.

A faculty chamber music recital on Oct. 8 by Eudice Shapiro, violinist; Sanford Schonbach, violist; Gabor Rejto, cellist, and Lillian Steuber, pianist, will open the USC musical year.

The USC symphony orchestra conducted by Walter Ducloux will feature Miss Shapiro as soloist Oct. 17, pianist Marilyn Neeley as soloist, Nov. 21, student soloists Feb. 27, and Miss Steuber as soloist May 22.

DR. DUCLOUX will stage and direct the USC Opera Theatre's American premiere of "Love on Trial" by Rossini-Rennert on Dec. 3, 5, and 12, and the West Coast premiere of "Mathis der Maler" by Hindemith on April 16, 22, and 24.
