Third 'G-Month' Slated For High School Grads

Torrance employers will be able to select new workers from the crop of 1966 high school graduates June 4 and 11 at the local office of the California State Employment Service, 1016 Sartori St.

The program, according to Mrs. June C. Roper, manager of the local office, was worked out by Arthur Morgan, area manager of the State Employment Service for metropolitan Los Angeles.

It will bring together employers and thousands of June high school graduates. Morgan said a greater-than-usual number of young men and women will be placed in permanent jobs because of the booming economy.

EMPLOYERS will be provided with facilities for interviewing graduates and several Torrance businessmen and industrialists already have reserved space, according to Mrs. Roper. Any employer seeking entry-level employees is invited to call Mrs. Roper at 328-2611 to reserve a desk for 4 and 11.

The massive job-interviewing program is being repeated throughout Los Angeles County for the third time. It is billed as "G-Month" ("G" stands for graduate).

ABOUT 5,100 June graduates are served by the Torrance office of the State Employment Service. Some 50 per cent will terminate their formal education in June, Morgan said.

"Most of these graduates have received vocational counseling and aptitude testing under our terminal student program," Morgan said. "Our tests indicate the types of jobs
