IN OTHER action, the council: • Approved a new policy for handling small claims against the city. Under the new policy, claims of less than \$50 will be filed with insurance companies without council action.



COUNCILMEN, after hearing Jahn's protests, moved to deny all such challenges "insofar as we have jurisdiction" and seated the re-elected members.

Also certified were results of balloting on three charter amendments. Voters rejected two proposed amendments which would have increased salaries of councilmen and the mayor.

A third amendment which prohibits the exposure of female breasts in public was approved. It must now be approved by the State Legislature before it becomes part of the city's charter.


