College President Will Direct Garvin Campaign

Dr. Wendell C. Black, president of Harbor College, today was named general chairman of Harold W. Garvin's campaign for the State Senate.

Garvin, a political science instructor at Harbor College, is seeking the Democratic nomination for the State Senate in the 32nd District.

"As our state grows in population and complexity," Dr. Black said, "it is important that the men we send to Sacramento be informed men. There is little room for costly errors any longer."

"WE NEED men in state government," he continued, "who know the problems of education and who understand what education can do for our citizens."

"I know Hal Garvin to be a hard worker, dedicated to building a better community and country, unselfish in his service to the young people of our Harbor Area, informed on the issues. He will serve the Harbor Area with devotion, courage, and integrity."

Dr. Black, 57, was born in Puyallup, Wash. He graduated from the University of Redlands in 1930 and received his master's degree at the University of Southern California in 1935. After 16 years as a high school teacher, he became an English instructor at Los Angeles City College and was later named a counselor.

HE BECAME dean of the college in 1953 and elevated to his present post in 1958. Dr. Black is a member of the California Teachers Association, the National Education Association, Pi Kappa Delta, Sigma Tau Delta, Delta Kappa, and Epsilon Pi Tau.

Dr. Black was president of the Los Angeles City College Faculty Association and a member of the executive board of the Southern California Junior College Association and chairman of the Commission on Higher Education of the California Teachers Association.

A member of the Riviera Methodist Church in Torrance, he serves on the board of the Wilmington chapter of the American Red Cross and was president of the Harbor Area Community Welfare Conference. Dr. Black is a member of the Harbor Area Community Welfare Conference. Dr. Black is a member and past president of the Wilmington Rotary Club and served as Harbor Area United Crusade chairman in 1965.

DR. BLACK is married and has four children. He has seven grandchildren.

Garvin, a decorated World War II bomber flier, long-time teacher, and an experienced community leader, has pledged "active, creative, courageous leadership to solve the host of urgent urban problems our district faces."

He has called for a new area of clean politics in California through reform of state election laws.

Garvin also has pledged to seek property tax reduction, smog control, rapid transit, increased recreation areas, and improved human relations.

Band Sets Concert

Band music in classical form will be performed Friday when the El Camino Concert Band appears in concert at the Campus Theater. There is no charge for the concert, which will begin at 8 p.m.

Lewis Hilgel, an El Camino music instructor, will direct the band. Friday's program will include selections by Robert Russell Bennett, Vittorio Giannini, Alfred Reed, and Heisinger.

"These composers are quite distinct from the composers of 'marching band' music," Hilgel said.

Morton Gould's "St. Lawrence Suite," a commemorative composition for the opening of the St. Lawrence power project in New York, will be featured.

Mike Crawford and Darrill Yale will solo on two anti-phonal trumpets.

The program also will include a double reed ensemble from the University of California at Los Angeles under the direction of Darrell Randall. The group includes two oboes and an English horn.
