Finally, after four hours of baseball, the Torrance-Rolling Hills game was called on account of darkness and the score was still 0-0.

The pitching was not only superb, but so was the defense and crowd reaction at Rolling Hills Field.

Bob Sharpe, who blanked Rolling Hills, 2-0, to open the season, went the distance against the Titans yesterday. He allowed six hits and struck out 24 batters.

But Gary Ryerson was equally superb. He fanned 20 batters, gave up 11 hits, but never allowed a Tartar to get to third base without two outs.

Both teams missed so many opportunities to cash in the victory, it became frustrating.

Rolling Hills came the closest to winning when Catcher Englehart doubled to lead off the fifth and Chris Krough bunted him to third with a single.

Shortstop Danny Kling made a putout without Englehart advancing and Sharpe cut him down on a tap to the mound.

In the 13th Kling and Bart Johnson went aboard with two away when Shortstop Marty Meagher threw out Dave McKenzie on a "photo call" at first.

Sharpe came to the game to pitch and not hit the ball. He was struck out in each of his six at bats by Ryerson.

The Tartars' top batter was Fred Kendall who clubbed two doubles and a single in six trips.



### CALIFORNIA BOWL GAME PROPOSED

Members of the Metropolitan and Eastern Conferences have agreed to propose to the California Junior College State Athletic Committee that a football bowl game be approved between the champions of the two leagues.

The name proposed for the event is the California Bowl.

The Anaheim City Council has been asked to enter into a contract to hold the championship bowl game in Anaheim Stadium Dec. 3, 1966.

Each conference has three members on the board. From the Metropolitan Conference are Don Hall of Cerritos, William Millington of Long Beach City College and Archie Morrison of Santa Monica City College.

Representing the Eastern Conference are Ralph Bradshaw, Riverside City College; Ivan Malm, Fullerton Junior College; and Joe Kroll, Orange Coast College.

Representatives of the Eastern and Metropolitan conferences will make the California Bowl request to the State Athletic Committee at its meeting May 27 in Modesto.

If the game is approved, league members must give first consideration to the California Bowl before playing in the Junior Rose Bowl Game.

Montgomery's Tom Thomson blanked Murphy for six innings for his fourth win of the season.


Friday's game against St. Monica's will be played at Torrance Park.
