Redondo Thumps South

Ken Jones also hit back to Moore who retired Cook at second for the second out. Jones took second before Pfau made his next pitch, and both Denhart and Jones scored on a pair of wild pitches.

Redondo led 1-0 in the first when Denhart singled home Larry Gray.

Sage Welles allowed two hits in the game, including a single by Ed Holmes in the second to score Mahon for South's lone run.

Redondo meets North today at Memorial Field in an effort to stay in the running. North has an 11-3 record while Redondo and Santa Monica are tied at 9-4 each.

Marlin McKeever, Tommy McDonald, Jack Snow and Bucky Pope, talented and exciting corps of veteran pass receivers, have signed their 1966 contracts, it was revealed today by club executive Elroy Hirsch.

Head coach George Allen, in noting the signings, indicated he is more than satisfied with the abilities of this group.

"Few clubs in the National League will have as much balance and all-around talent at the receiving positions," Allen commented.

"I rate McKeever right at the top of the NFL's tight ends. Certainly there is no more determined blocker at that position anywhere and he ranked among the top 15 in the league in total catches last year with 44 even though he missed two full games.

"Tommy (McDonald) is a top competitor and, coming from the Bears, I can say it is nice to have him on our side now. He caught a lot of passes (67) to rank 2nd in the NFL last year and we expect him to catch a lot this year."

The new head coach also indicated he did not feel Pope's great 1964 rookie season was a "fluke". The 6-5 "Catawba Claw" was sidelined for the entire 1965 league season with a knee in-

Steve Sibley, who faces Redondo today, had 12 strikeouts to beat Hawthorne last Friday.

Track Set For South, Torrance
