Red Cross Calls for Additional Volunteers

Training for volunteer work with the Red Cross blood program will be offered Tuesday for persons in Gardena, Harbor City, Lomita, Palos Verdes, San Pedro, Torrance and Wilmington interested in serving in this community service program.

Sponsored by the Southern District of the Los Angeles Red Cross Chapter, the orientation program will be conducted from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. at the Los Angeles-Orange Counties Regional Blood Center, 1100 S. Vermont Ave.

Coordinating transportation for persons interested in attending are the volunteer chairmen for each of the five Southern District Red Cross Branches who are responsible for staffing bloodmobiles: Miss Catherine Hunter, Gardena; Mrs. Maurice Allen, San Pedro-Palos Verdes; Mrs. Edward Berrara, Torrance-Lomita; and Mrs. K. L. Haar, Wilmington.

The 39th Engineer Battalion and units of the 47th Vietnamese Army Engineers cleared a 32-mile segment of the road, building several bridge bypasses and a large bridge, in two days of work. Webb entered the Army in March, 1961, and arrived in Viet Nam last January.

A recent Defense Department request for 250,000 pints of blood by June 30 has resulted in a need for additional volunteers to serve in the various phases of blood program work. Volunteer jobs in conjunction with a bloodmobile operation range from registering donors to assisting nurses and serving refreshments.

In addition, there is a vast need for volunteers to help with the on-going work in recruiting donors and keeping record up-to-date, it was reported.

Mrs. Barbara Barber, administrative assistant in the Southern District who coordinates volunteer work, said no particular skills are necessary, the only requirement is that a volunteer be willing and interested in helping.

"Our SOS is not only directed to women, but men too," she said. Two retired men have joined their wives as Red Cross volunteers in Wilmington and work as aides to the staff nurses in the donor room.
