

# Carpentry Students Win Top Honors at Meeting

Carpentry apprenticeship in America, which dates back to the Mayflower, still has an important place in modern education at El Camino College.

The college offers two apprenticeship programs. The first, a pre-employment plan, consists of day classes for two years. Students build houses on campus and receive other instruction in carpentry.

The second plan for apprentices is an evening program in which students usually take four hours of class per week.

"Those who complete the two-year plan usually go to work as advanced apprentices in carpentry. This enables them to go on and become foremen, supervisors and contractors," Dr. G. Theodore Elmgren Jr., coordinator of instruction for the El Camino College industrial arts department, explained.

CARPENTRY apprentices undergo a four-year program, consisting of eight six-month periods, with exams at the end of each period. Apprentices must attend a minimum of 144 hours of school per year, in compliance with California's Shelly-Malone Act.

Recently the Los Angeles County Joint Apprenticeship Committees held completion ceremonies at the Rodger Young Auditorium to honor those apprentices who have completed their four-year training program and have

become journeymen carpenters.

Representing El Camino College at the ceremony were Dr. William H. Harless, vice president of instructors in the industrial and technical arts department, and Dr. Elmgren. They were accompanied by their wives.

THOSE WHO completed the El Camino carpentry program were Clarron R. Barker, Robert E. Burris, Jack Norman Daniels, Donald J. DiManno, Oran K. Doty, Ward L. Fairchild, Max P. Fischer, Adrian Foss, Ivan L. Gallyer, Ronald M. Gilbert, Ronald J. Householder, Robert S. Keller, Donald T. Massey, Delbert Medlock, Daniel T. Mellillo, Norman Mikkelsen, Dennis L. Perry, Robin Radford, James Remy, Paul E. Tarcala, Donald Tilden, and Alan G. Winger.

Among those honored as outstanding apprentices for each area were El Camino College students, Gilbert, Local 25; Fischer, Local 1500; and Daniels, Local 1752.

"The apprentice program gives good carpenters who know the ins and outs—the scientific principles and the theory of carpentry," Elmgren said. "These fellows who have completed the program will be future leaders," he predicted.

A unique feature of the El Camino carpentry program is that students can register and begin classes any time during the semester.

## Taxpayers' Revolt Brews In State, Finch Believes

"A taxpayers' revolt" is brewing in California, according to Robert Finch, Republican candidate for Lieutenant Governor.

Finch, making his first bid for statewide office, said that the recent municipal elections in Southern California were "more than straws in the political winds—they are a clear indication that California's home-owners and renters feel they have reached the limit in what they can

afford to pay in residential property taxes."

FINCH, WHO directed Senator George Murphy's upset victory in 1964, said he "could not remember a time in the last 20 years when more incumbent city and county officials were turned out, or narrowly re-elected, including several with two or more terms in office. Nor can you overlook the fact that so many local bond issues and tax-overrides have been defeated since the first of the year—11 out of 20 in Los Angeles County, 6 out of 10 in Orange County, and 5 out of 7 in Santa Barbara County.

"This is a very serious matter," Finch continued. "Historically, Californians have voted to tax themselves heavily to build a superior public school system. This has been one of the important reasons for our state's growth in the post-war period.

"I do not believe that the voters have reached their present state of mind lightly, and I see no evidence that this trend will be reversed unless the present administration is removed.

"THE PEOPLE of California are demanding that property taxes must stop going up and up. Yet, at the same time, we have to build more and more classrooms to educate our children. Obviously, those who would exercise leadership in California must face up to these conflicting needs. Our tax burden must be re-apportioned away from present imbalance.

"There isn't any easy answer, and no tax system can be devised that will please everybody; but the status quo

has to be changed, because it will no longer be tolerated by the California voters," Finch concluded.
