Two Girls To Attend Institute

Two Torrance High students have been selected to participate in a summer institute at the Midwestern Music and Art Camp sponsored by the University of Kansas. Camilla Sumowski, a junior, and Virginia Roberts, a sophomore, will participate in the program which involves advanced studies in German, June 19 through July 31 in Lawrence, Kan., according to Dr. Carl R. Ahee, Torrance High principal. More than 1,200 high school students from throughout the nation will attend the institute. Classes in German literature, culture, composition, conversation, pronunciation, and vocabulary building will be conducted.

Adult School to Offer Classes During Summer

Adult education summer school will be offered at all four high schools in Torrance this summer for the first time, according to Raymond Collins, principal of Torrance Evening High School. Classes will take place June 20 through July 29. Registration for students who wish to receive credit toward a high school diploma will begin Monday, May 16, from 7 to 9:30 p.m. in the adult education office, 2200 W. Carson St. No registrations for credit will be accepted after Friday, June 25. Persons wishing to register for credit are asked to make an appointment with a counselor. Appointments may be made by phoning 328-8080, Ext. 295, days or FA 8-9206 evenings. Offerings at Torrance High School will include: modern science, algebra, bookkeeping, business machines, citizenship, English for the foreign born, English Review I, II, and III, general mathematics, oil painting, conversational Spanish, beginning shorthand, brushup shorthand, beginning typewriting, brushup and electric typewriting, U.S. government II, U.S. history I, sewing and dressmaking, and traffic safety education. Woodshop will be offered at North High School, physical fitness for women at South High, and psychology for parents at West High. Fees will include a \$3 tuition charge for non-credit courses and a 25 cent incidental fee for new students who have not been in attendance during the current school year. No fees of any kind will be charged for classes in English for the foreign born or for classes in citizenship.

Ocean View Club Gives Garvin Nod

Harold Garvin, a Harbor College instructor seeking the Democratic nomination for the State Senate in the 32nd District, has been endorsed by the Ocean View Democratic Club. Garvin also received a \$300 campaign contribution from the club. Garvin was endorsed by the club "for his forthright stand on local issues," according to Marvin Turner, president of the group. "We have needed more representation in Sacramento for a long time to fight for our area in educational, employment, pollution, fisheries, and transportation problems," Turner said. "Professor Garvin's ideas and energy, along with Vince Thomas' experience, should get things moving around here," he declared.
