

### Named Metro Coach of Year

Wallace "Wally" Kincaid, Cerritos College baseball coach, has been named recipient of the James K. Cossman "Coach of the Year" award for 1965-66 in the Metropolitan Conference. Formal announcement of the award was made by William W. Russell, commissioner of the conference. There are six criteria for the award, according to Russell. They include (1) inspiration to young men; (2) leadership; (3) integrity; (4) sportsmanship; (5) competence as a coach. Not necessarily a winner, but one who best utilizes his material; (6) coaching in one or more Metropolitan Conference competitive sports. In nine years at the helm of the Cerritos baseball team, Kincaid has coached the Falcons to a 272-69 overall record and 117-25 in league competition.
