Fiesta To Open Friday

The 20th annual Mary Star of the Sea Fiesta will open Friday at Mary Star of the Sea High School, 810 Eighth St., San Pedro, according to Samuel Palmer, general chairman.

Features at the three-day event, which annually attracts

some 75,000 visitors, will include a queen contest, carnival rides, typical Italian, Slavonian, and fish dinners, and game booths.

Vying for the Queen's title this year are Jeanette Gargas, 18, and Betty Ann Sheets, 18, both of Mary Star of the Sea High School, and San Pedro High School juniors Jean Menzell and Terry Virgason, both 16.

A 1966 model car, a stereo console, color television, and man's wardrobe are among the prizes to be awarded during the fiesta. All proceeds from the event will go to the Mary Star of the Sea Parish Building Fund.

Theme of the fiesta is "Old California Days." Carnival booths will open at 5 p.m.

Friday and Saturday and at 1 p.m. Sunday. Voting for the queen will continue until 5:30 p.m. Sunday, with the winner to be crowned at 8 p.m. Sunday.

More than 700 volunteer workers will be on hand to man booths and rides during the three-day event.

Cities Get \$1 Million From Taxes

More than \$1.2 million in taxes has been paid to cities in the Southern California Gas Co. Southwest district, S. W. Lynch, division manager, announced today.

Lynch said the gas company paid \$1,287,000 in taxes during 1965 to the cities of El Segundo, Gardena, Hawthorne, Inglewood, Manhattan Beach, Redondo Beach, and Torrance.

The total tax bill includes city, school, county, and special district taxes, as well as revenues which the cities received from franchise fees and business licenses.

The total gas company tax bill in Los Angeles County, including franchise and license fees, amounted to \$14.5 million, Lynch said, while the total bill in Southern California exceeded \$20 million.

Big Hall to House County Fair Doings

A building almost as big as the fields and forests that produce its attractions houses everything from oranges to miniature waterfalls at the Los Angeles County Fair.

The huge Agricultural Building — one of the largest structures of concrete and steel in America with an unsupported roof — provides 117,600 square feet (two and two-thirds acres) of space for exhibits from 24 California counties, 34 cities, seven farm bureaus and granges, plus space for agricultural and industrial features.

Displays range from colorful citrus racks of oranges, lemons and grapefruit to transported redwoods and reconstructed log cabins.

Most exhibitors feature the item their county or city is famous for, whether it be the largest sunflower head or the tallest corn stalk or the largest fish. Cash prizes and trophies are offered to winning exhibitors in the competition.

Slightly less than four miles of six-foot tube lights illuminate the 800-foot long building night and day during the fair's 17-day run Sept. 13 through Oct. 2.

Since its construction in 1948, the colorful building has played host annually to more than a million visitors from every state in the union.
