Final Swim Sessions Slated at El Camino

Registration for the final two sessions of instructional swimming classes at El Camino College will be held Saturday, July 30, beginning at 8 a.m. in the Campus Center.

Two two-week sessions remain in the college's swimming program. The first session begins Aug. 1 and runs through Aug. 12. The final session is scheduled from Aug. 15 to 26.

Four classes are scheduled for 7-, 8- and 9-year-olds, beginning at 9 and 11 a.m. and 2 and 3 p.m. Classes for children between 10 and 12 will be held at 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Three classes are set for those 13 and older with starting times of 1 in the afternoon and at 7 and 8 o'clock in the evening. All regular classes are one hour in length. Minimum age requirement is 7 years of age and minimum height is 50 inches.

CLASSES in lifesaving for 12-year olds and over will be held at 1, 2, 7 and 8 p.m. and will run for a two-hour period.

A water safety side class for those 14 and over is set for 2 p.m. It is limited to 20 students.

Registration fee for the two-week regular class offerings is \$1. The cost of the two-week life saving classes is \$2. All swimmers must furnish their own suits and towels. Girls must also have a bathing cap.

A FULL complement of 720 students was registered for the first three sessions of the summer program which began June 20.

All classes are supervised by El Camino College physical education instructors and student recreational leaders.

Tickets not sold during the July 30 registration period may be purchased in the business office of the college the following Monday.

Profits Increase Despite New Office, Bank Reports


An increase of some \$4 million deposits, including deposits of \$2.5 million recorded in a new Torrance office, was reported for the first six months of 1966 by Imperial Bank.

In a report to shareholders, George M. Eltinge, chairman of the bank's board, and George L. Graziadio, president, said net operating profits for the period totaled \$124,629 — an increase of \$72,629 despite "unusual and non-recurring expenses involved in the opening of our new Torrance office."

The bank reported an increase of 29 per cent in deposits and noted that the loan-deposit ratio "is much lower than most Southern California banks." Only 37 per cent of the total deposits are in interest-bearing savings and time deposits, the report said.

Total resources as of June 30 totaled \$20,528,559, compared to \$15,763,857 last Dec. 31. Demand deposits totaled \$11.2 million, up from \$9.3 million, and time and savings deposits were reported at nearly \$6.6 million, an increase of about 30 per cent over the figures for last Dec. 31.
