

The picnic is open to the public and a special invitation has been extended by parents and friends of the members by Power.

The Gardena Valley Boys Band was organized July 1, 1960. Membership in the band is open to all area boys in grades five through nine. Auditions may be scheduled by calling Power at FR 5-6387. No musical training is necessary, as the band conducts regular classes.

The band performs at concerts at Christmas and in the spring. Appearances are scheduled throughout the year in parades, hospitals, and aboard ships. The band most recently marched in the Lomita Anniversary Parade, winning first place in its division.
