

Completion Near For New College

Specially designed facilities for California State College at Dominguez Hills, located at 809 E. Victoria St., Gardena, are nearing completion a full month ahead of schedule, according to an announcement made last week by college officials.

Archery Classes To Meet

Despite distinct sounds of whistling arrows, Torrance residents in the vicinity of Entradero Park need not worry about a possible Indian uprising, the Torrance Recreation Department reports.

Arrows, targets, youngsters, and housewives seen in the area are all part of a planned archery program sponsored by the Recreation Department. Classes meet regularly at Entradero Park between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays.

Nearly 50 persons, including 18 housewives, completed their sixth lesson this week, making way for new classes.

Youngsters 10 to 18 years old and adults may participate in the three-week sessions by enrolling at the Joslyn Recreation Center, 3335 Torrance Blvd. A fee of \$1 covers use of equipment and entitles entrants to 9 hours of instruction.

Further information on the archery program may be obtained by calling the city's Joslyn Recreation Center, or by visiting Entradero Park during hours of instruction. The park is located at 5500 Towers St.

The schedule calls for the college to occupy the structures Sept. 1, but tentative plans are being made to move into the buildings early in August.

Along with the move to expanded quarters located near the permanent site of the college, the college will expand its curriculum offerings. Juniors entered in the fall will be able to select a major from several new fields.

A faculty of about 30 members will serve the college during the coming year, according to Dr. Leo F. Cain, president of the college.



ADVANCING

On May 27, 1966 we started an advertising campaign on radio, TV, newspapers, posters and by word of mouth. This campaign was to call attention to the new information number "411" and the new repair number "611."

We are standardizing our system and preparing for future advances in telephone communications. In the past you have been able to reach your information operator by dialing "113" or "411" and the repair clerk by dialing "114" or "611." However, by dialing either "113" or "114" you will be intercepted and asked to dial "411" or "611." This change is essential and will be more profitable to you for the eventual ease and simplicity of telephone usage.
