Birth Defects Target Of Educational Drive

Among the 400,000 babies born last year in California, an estimated 28,000 came into the world with serious physical or mental birth defects, according to Evelle J. Younger, Los Angeles County District Attorney.

Younger, who is co-chairman of the Los Angeles County March of Dimes campaign, said 10,000 of the babies did not live through their first year. The leading cause of these deaths was birth defects.

"If these disabling conditions and infant deaths were caused by an epidemic disease, the people of California and the nation would be up in arms," Younger said. "Even dreaded polio, in the years before vaccines were available, never took such a toll."

Public education is of prime importance in the war against birth defects, Younger said. The March of Dimes program, he explained is designed:

To combat the popular tendency to think of birth defects as rare, individual misfortunes that happen only to "other people."

To awaken the public to the magnitude of the problem and its enormous cost to families, communities, and even society at large.

To inform families and prospective parents that there are ways to prevent some birth defects, and that modern medical treatment can help many children born

Retired Judge Named To Direct Finch Bid

Judge Frederick F. Houser, recently retired from the Superior Court and former Lieutenant Governor of California, has been named Honorary State Chairman of the Robert Finch campaign for the number two post in California. Finch, who won the Republican nomination by an overwhelming margin in the June primary, is seeking to unseat Glenn Anderson in his first bid for statewide office. Judge Houser, who retired this year after 35 years of the public service, will not only be honorary chairman, but will work actively in the campaign as a leader in the volunteer force, Finch said. "I'm pleased that a man

with Judge Houser's record of public service has joined our campaign," Finch said. "Not only is he a man who has a very unusual distinction of having served in all three branches of state government—legislative, executive, and judicial—he will be invaluable as an advisor to me on the important duties of the Lieutenant Governor."

Judge Houser was first elected to the State Legislature in 1930 and served three terms. He was elected Lieutenant Governor in 1942, was Republican nominee for the United States Senate in 1944, losing narrowly to the Democratic incumbent, and was elected judge of the Superior Court in 1946. He was re-elected to the bench three times.

Don't Touch Blasting Caps; Avoid Mishaps

Nearly 50 million boys and girls, are enjoying a vacation from school this summer. More than 125 million blasting caps are used annually in the nation in mining, quarrying, road building, lumbering, irrigation, and seismological exploration operations. These two facts appear to have nothing in common. And they don't—until some curious youngster finds a lost, strayed, or stolen blasting cap, according to spokesmen for the Institute of Makers of Explosives (IME). An unintended, uninformed introduction to the small de-

vice which detonates explosives can be the start of events leading to serious injuries or death, the IME spokesman said. Summertime is when most blasting cap accidents occur. The total number of blasting cap mishaps each year is quite small, but each is needless and avoidable, the spokesman said. Anyone finding a cap should report it immediately to the nearest law enforcement officer, fireman, or military unit. Blasting caps are not playthings, he added. Don't touch them.
