Purple Heart awardees are being sought in the Torrance, Lomita, Harbor City, Hawthorne, and Gardena areas to become charter members of a new chapter of the Military Order of the Purple Heart of the United States of America.

Objective of the new chapter will be to assist all veterans, particularly Purple Heart recipients in obtaining available federal and state benefits.

The Purple Heart decoration is the oldest military decoration in the world still in use and the first United States award available to enlisted personnel. General George Washington created the award during the Revolutionary War. It is available to all combat-wounded veterans.

# \$1.7 Million Spent On Area Road Work

Have an easier time getting to the office or shopping center today?

If so, chances are good that you used one or more of the Torrance's four major road projects completed or nearly completed during the 1965-66 fiscal year.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace disclosed today that \$1,743,000 was spent on Torrance area highways by the County Road Department during this period.

Of the four projects, one is completed. Completion of the other three is expected soon.

CHACE MADE the report after reviewing figures released in the County Road Department's annual Summary of Highway Construction. Chace, chairman of the Board of Supervisors, also serves as chairman of the board's Road Committee.

The Torrance projects were part of a record-breaking \$21,674,000 budget of major construction spent by the Road Department. This is an increase of 68 per cent in the total budget, Chace said.

"This extensive highway construction — in the Torrance area and elsewhere — provides much needed improvements to keep abreast with the needs of our ever-mounting county motor vehicle registrations," Chace said. "In addition, it creates a market for millions of dollars worth of materials, labor and other related services to bolster our economy."

HERE ARE the Torrance area projects in progress during fiscal 1966-67:

**Carson Street (Normandie Avenue to Harbor Freeway):** This \$424,000 project in the Carson area was started in April and will be completed in November. Work includes widening of 1.25 miles into six lanes, fully curbed. It also provides for improvement of about half a mile section of Vermont Avenue near Carson Street.

The project is the first stage of a programmed 2.4 mile stretch of Carson Street between Normandie Avenue and San Diego Freeway.

**Crenshaw Boulevard (Near Palos Verdes Drive North):** This \$208,000 project is scheduled for completion this month. Work consists of reconstructing a 1,900-foot section of Palos Verdes Drive North to six-lane, divided, fully curbed highways.

The project is the first of four phases programmed for improvement of Crenshaw between Pacific Coast Highway and Crest Road.

**Sepulveda Boulevard (Main Street to Avalon Boulevard):** Work is under way on this \$323,000 project and will be completed in October.

The work on this one-mile section of Sepulveda will provide a six-lane, divided highway with traffic controls.

This is the first stage of the programmed improvement of a three-mile stretch of Sepulveda between Main Street and the Terminal Island Freeway.

**223rd Street (Main Street to Avalon Boulevard):** Work on this \$355,000 project was completed in May.

The project includes the reconstruction and widening of the predominantly two-lane roadway to an 80-foot highway.

Curbs and traffic signals were included in the project.

This was part of a multi-stage project for the improvement of 223rd Street between Normandie Avenue and Santa Fe Avenue.
