

It's Not a Strike, It's Just a Small Revolution

The one thing that clearly emerged from the recent State Senate fact finding committee hearings in Delano is that the months-long farm labor disturbances in that area are not a labor-management dispute, in the normal meaning of the term.

Ramparts Magazine, a leading organ of the New Left movement, captions a recent series of articles on the dispute as "Tales of the Delano Revolution."

Cesar Chavez, head of the National Farm Workers Association, was asked at the hearings:

"Is it true that the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee, the Marxist oriented W. E. B. Dubois Clubs and CORE were brought into this dispute?"

He replied: "Before we began picketing the grape growers, I did contact SNCC and CORE."

The Schenley Corporation, which signed a contract with the NFWA without the consent of its workers, testified that the "strike" itself was not effective, and that the company had no difficulty getting all the workers it needed. The company yielded to the NFWA pressure because of "bad publicity" and "pressure from clergymen."

A spokesman for the Di Giorgio Corporation, which has refused to recognize the NFWA unilaterally and has sought to allow its workers the right to decide on union recognition in an election, testified:

"Almost entirely, the NFWA demonstrators have been imported from outside the area. I have seen writers for Ramparts Magazine, attorneys and ministers from San Francisco and other cities, social workers, organizers, and members of so-called New Left organizations on the NFWA picket lines."

But with only a handful of exceptions, workers from the Sierra Vista Ranch and other ranches in the Delano area have not joined in these demonstrations."

The Delano "revolution" appears to be merely one small part of a larger "revolution," other manifestations of which have included the Berkeley free and filthy speech movements, draft card burnings, blood bank drives for the Viet Cong, and the tossing of Molotov cocktails in racial ghettos.

A generation ago, the Old Left had a great, burning goal in mind: to follow Russia's lead in bringing about a Communist state, where life would be perfect in every respect.

The New Left, for the

most part, is as disillusioned with Communism as anyone else. If the new revolutionaries have any clearly defined goal in mind, other than raising hell for the sheer fun of it, it hasn't yet been disclosed.

Mrs. Dee Wittcombe of Torrance has been named chairman of the Women's Anti-Narcotics Committee of the 68th Assembly District, John D. Kirby, Republican candidate in the 68th District, announced.

Mrs. Wittcombe, most recently served as an aide in the successful campaign of an Ohio Congressman.

Noting Ohio has enacted penalties of from 20 years to life which are mandatory upon conviction for illegal sale of dangerous drugs or narcotics, Mrs. Wittcombe said, "It is shocking to find that a person convicted in California of peddling drugs to minors can be released in five years."

She also said that blame for juvenile narcotics problems "must be placed with the incumbent office holders."

The committee which she heads petitions seeking a minimum mandatory penalty of 30 years in prison for any person convicted of selling a narcotic or dangerous drug to a minor.

"The incumbent office holders have not seen fit to do what should have been done long ago," Mrs. Wittcombe said. "Now we have to accumulate 100,000 signatures to send to Sacramento with Mr. Kirby to take before the State Assembly for action to protect our young people."
