

# State Welfare Cost Is Too High -- Finch

Change in direction of California's welfare program was urged today by Robert H. Finch, candidate for lieutenant governor.

"We cannot afford, either financially or morally, to continue on the Democratic-charted course which this state has been following since 1959," Finch said. "It has only caused increased dependency upon public assistance and a corresponding increase in cost."

The 1966-67 state budget calls for a \$1.6 billion expenditure of federal, state, and local money for welfare programs. About \$500 million of this amount is state money, the equivalent of 17 per cent of the total budget. An average of one of each 17 Californians received some form of welfare assistance.

The application of space-age techniques may well provide some of the answers necessary to break the present trend.

"Recent announcement by the administration that California will use modern space analyses to study its welfare system is commendable," Finch said, "but it should be emphasized that the appropriation to finance the study was part of the program sponsored by the Republicans in the assembly during the 1965 session."

State funds for the study were authorized in a bill introduced by Assemblyman John G. Veneman (R-Modesto), who is serving as chair-

man of the Finch for Lieutenant Governor campaign.

"Properly conducted, a study of this nature could find ways of eliminating the blizzard of paper work facing our social workers and provide them with more time to spend on actual case work with the recipients. Californians have a right to demand that our welfare system move toward reducing, not perpetuating, dependency upon public assistance," the GOP standard-bearer concluded.

# Registrar Urges Students To Check Counselors Now

Prospective students who will be attending El Camino College for the first time during the coming fall semester should contact the college's admissions office for a counseling appointment now, according to Leo M. Christian, dean of admissions.

"Students who will be registering with us for the first time should get in to see us as early as possible in order to complete the necessary tests and to see a counselor," Christian said.

The admissions office is open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday and from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Fridays.

AN ESTIMATED 16,000 students are expected to enroll for the fall term at El Camino. Last fall's enrollment was 15,000.

Placement tests are required before students may register for courses in English, foreign languages, shorthand, mathematics and chemistry unless satisfactory college work has already been completed in the respective area at another institution, Christian added.

College ability tests are also required of new students who plan to enroll in 10 or more units. Part-time students who plan to transfer to a four-year college must also take the ability tests.

"THE REQUIRED tests must be completed at least one week before registration. Reservations for these tests are necessary and may be made in the admissions office," Christian stated.

Registration for new full-time students will be held Aug. 23 through 31 and Sept. 1 and 2. Exact time and date will be assigned to students during their counseling appointments.

New part-time students must pick up a reservation to register prior to enrolling for classes. These reservation slips are available in the admissions office. Registration date for new part-time students are Aug. 29 through Sept. 1 from 5:15 to 7:30 p.m. and Sept. 2 from 12:30 to 2 p.m.

Full-time students who attended El Camino last spring will register Aug. 18 and 19.

"ONLY FULL-TIME students who present their spring 1966 grade slips and priority registration permits approved by a counselor may register at this time," Christian added.

"The time of a specific individual's registration will be determined by the permanent registration number found on his priority permit."

Part-time returning students will register Aug. 22 between 1 and 3 p.m. and 5:15 to 7:30 in the evening. Students must present either their spring semester grade slip or a No. 5 card in order to register. Sequence of registration will be by permanent registration numbers.

CLASSES FOR the fall term begin Monday, Sept. 12. "This is the last possible day to register. Students who register this late should anticipate that most classes at desirable hours may be closed," Christian added.

Placement tests, if required, must have been completed prior to Sept. 2, in order to register during the late-registration period.
